

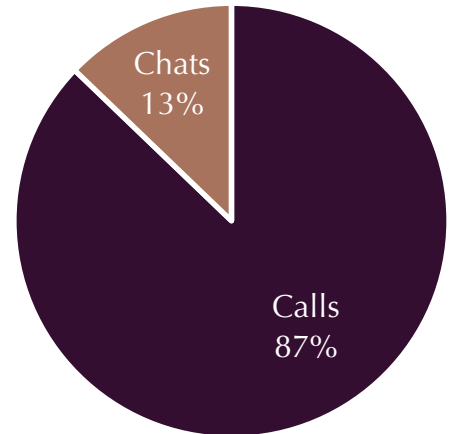


State Report: Alaska

StrongHearts Native Helpline is the first 24/7 culturally appropriate domestic, dating and sexual violence helpline for American Indians and Alaska Natives, offering peer support, crisis intervention, personalized safety planning and referrals to Native-centered service providers.

StrongHearts was created by and for Native Americans, a population with some of the highest rates of domestic violence in the United States. Tribes, as sovereign nations, face significant jurisdictional hurdles when addressing violent crimes in their communities. Gaps in Native-centered supportive services create unique barriers for Native victims seeking help.

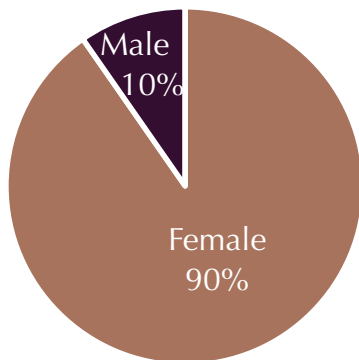


What are the top barriers Native Intimate Partner Violence (IPV) victims are facing?

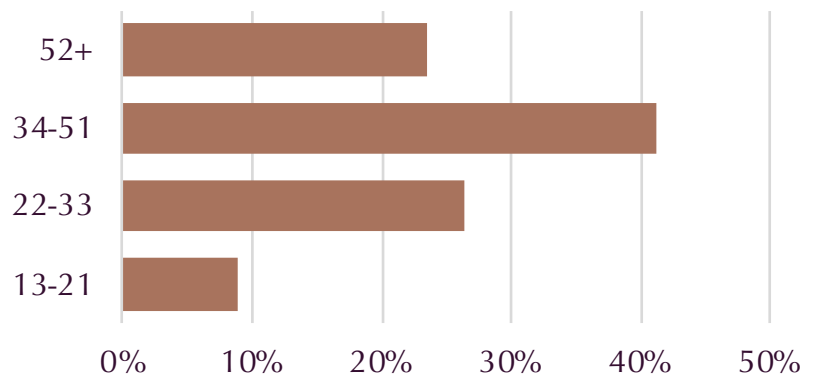
