MCAS and Accountability Results

- Grades 3-8: Increase of 3 percentage points in ELA and flat results in math as compared to 2024
- Grade 10: ELA decreased 6 percentage points and math decreased 3 percentage points as compared to 2024. Some evidence of impact from Question 2.
- Science: Flat results in grade 5 and decreases in grades 8 (2 percentage points) and 10 (3 percentage points)
- Grade 8 students tested in Civics for the first time.
- 55% of schools making substantial progress towards, meeting or exceeding accountability targets as compared to 60% in 2024.

Overall Accountability Classification

Schools are classified as "Requiring assistance or intervention" if they meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Designated as a Chronically Underperforming School
- Designated as an Underperforming School
- Among the lowest performing 10% of schools in the state
- High school with a graduation rate below 66.7%
- Among the lowest performing student groups in the state
- Not meeting assessment participation requirements



2025 School Accountability Results

 All schools receive an overall accountability classification that describes the need for assistance or intervention

- Total of 1,817 schools in the 2024-25 school year
 - 227 received a classification of "Insufficient data" primarily because the school did not serve any tested grades (e.g., PK-2 school)
- Of the remaining 1,590 schools:
 - 1,310 (82%) were classified as "Not requiring assistance or intervention"
 - 280 (18%) were classified as "Requiring assistance or intervention" for one or more reasons



Progress Towards Targets

55% of schools in MA made substantial progress towards, met, or exceeded their accountability targets as compared to 60% in 2024
