On 8/5/2026 between approximately 2300 hours and 2359 hours, two unidentified male suspects committed the following crimes against (V1) [REDACTED] and (V2) [REDACTED] near 19th Ave/Broadway Rd, Phoenix, AZ.

The two suspects and suspect vehicle are unidentified at the time of this report.

This is being documented as an agency assistance report for the Phoenix Police Department, who is taking disposition of this investigation (Phoenix PD 26-1085250).

*****Agency Assist*****

On 8/6/2026 at approximately 0011 hours, I responded to the area of Baseline Rd/Priest Dr, reference a call for service of a disabled vehicle. Call comments stated an MCSO Deputy had located a disabled vehicle, unknown what the hazard was. The MCSO Deputy had observed a male subject, later identified as (V1) [REDACTED], walking away from the vehicle, however lost visual of [REDACTED]

Upon my arrival, I observed a red 2014 Dodge Charger (AZ [REDACTED]) parked and unoccupied, in the #1 southbound lane of Priest Dr, just north of Baseline Rd. The vehicle was not running. There was a burning smell coming from the vehicle and the smell of burnt rubber from the tires. I observed the driver window was broken, pulled outwards from the vehicle, however there was no broken glass in the street.

I requested dispatch inquire over PSAP if this vehicle had recently fled from neighboring agencies. Dispatch advised me that no agencies reported having contact with this vehicle tonight.

After determining the vehicle had not fled from law enforcement, I contacted the registered owner of the



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vehicle, [REDACTED] by phone to determine whether she knew the whereabouts of her vehicle. Simultaneously, Tempe Police Dispatch contacted Phoenix Police Dispatch, to request an agency assist in making contact with [REDACTED] at her apartment.

****Contact with [REDACTED]****

[REDACTED] stated her son, (V1) [REDACTED], has permission to drive her vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the key to the vehicle was not in her apartment, so she believed [REDACTED] was currently in possession of the vehicle. [REDACTED] stated if the vehicle was located near Baseline Rd/Priest Dr, [REDACTED] was likely going to a family member's residence in Guadalupe. While speaking to [REDACTED] there was a knock at her front door. [REDACTED] opened the front door and advised me that [REDACTED] girlfriend, (V2) [REDACTED] had arrived at their apartment.

I could hear [REDACTED]'s voice in the background. [REDACTED]'s voice sounded scared. [REDACTED] advised [REDACTED] that she and [REDACTED] were pulled over by Police, and he drove away from the traffic stop. [REDACTED] stated [REDACTED] was driving the red Dodge Charger, and she did not know where [REDACTED] currently was.

****Contact with (V2) [REDACTED]****

The following is a summary of my contact with [REDACTED] and is not verbatim. For more details, please refer to body worn camera footage.

I learned the following information from [REDACTED], while speaking with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] over the phone. [REDACTED] was driving the red Dodge Charger and [REDACTED] was the front passenger. They were inside the vehicle, parked on a street next to his apartment complex [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] saw the Police vehicle on that street. After [REDACTED] began driving, the Police vehicle followed them, driving closely behind the Dodge Charger. Police then stopped the Dodge Charger, touching their front bumper to the rear bumper of the Dodge Charger. [REDACTED] stated the Police smashed the window and tased them both. [REDACTED] also stated the Police told [REDACTED] they were going to shoot him. Police threw [REDACTED]'s phone from the vehicle. Police removed [REDACTED] from the vehicle, handcuffed her, and placed her in the back of their Police car. [REDACTED] drove away from the traffic stop, then Police removed [REDACTED] from handcuffs and released her.

[REDACTED] stated she was tased on her leg and arm. When asked if [REDACTED] had any visible injuries from the taser, [REDACTED] stated she did not see any, but also stated she was not sure what the injuries would look like.

[REDACTED] stated she then walked home, approximately one hour. When asked where this occurred, [REDACTED] stated it occurred in Phoenix, on 19th Ave. [REDACTED] stated there was a Jack in the Box, Circle K, and a tire shop nearby.

I believed this incident occurred near Broadway Rd/19th Ave in Phoenix. At this intersection, there is a Jack in the Box, Circle K, tire shop, and auto shops nearby. This is also an approximate 45-minute walk to [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] apartment.



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I requested dispatch inquire over PSAP again, if this vehicle had recently fled from neighboring agencies. Dispatch advised me that no agencies, including Phoenix Police, reported having contact with this vehicle tonight.

██████████ advised me that ██████████ cellphone did not currently have service. I attempted to contact ██████████ by phone, however received a message that it was not currently accepting calls.

I advised ██████████ that the vehicle was being towed from the roadway by All City Towing, to 1600 N Delaware St, Chandler, AZ. Prior to releasing the vehicle, it was inventoried by Officer Becker. The tow driver did not enter the vehicle to tow the vehicle.

I observed a single black sneaker (left shoe) on the driver's floorboard, which stood out to me. Photographs of the vehicle were uploaded to Evidence.com.

Shortly after clearing the call for service, I began to believe that ██████████ and ██████████ may have been victims of an attempted carjacking by suspects impersonating Police Officers.

At approximately 0245 hours, I attempted to contact ██████████ and ██████████ by phone to obtain additional information regarding the individuals identifying themselves as Police Officers and the circumstances surrounding the traffic stop. I made multiple attempts to call but was unsuccessful. I left ██████████ a message, encouraging ██████████ and ██████████ to report this incident to Phoenix Police, and advised ██████████ that I would follow up with her in the afternoon at the start of my shift.

****Contact with ██████████****

At approximately 1600 hours, I contacted ██████████ by phone. ██████████ advised me that ██████████ and ██████████ had not yet reported this to Phoenix Police, out of fear. ██████████ advised me that ██████████ believed it was possibly Phoenix Police who had pulled him over the night before and was "extremely terrified" to speak with Police. ██████████ also stated ██████████ was fearful he would be arrested for driving away from the traffic stop. I assured ██████████ that there was no history of any law enforcement agency conducting a traffic stop of her Dodge Charger the night prior. I advised ██████████ that I believed ██████████ and ██████████ were victims of a crime, not suspects, and asked her if ██████████ would feel comfortable speaking with me. ██████████ stated she would contact me if ██████████ desired to speak with me.

██████████ took ██████████ to be treated at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center, at approximately 0400 hours. ██████████ uploaded photographs of ██████████ and ██████████'s injuries to Evidence.com, through the provided citizen upload link.

I advised ██████████ that I would be documenting this information in an agency assist report, and providing this information to the Phoenix Police Department, as the suspected crime occurred within their jurisdiction. I also advised her that the Phoenix Police Department may follow up with ██████████ and ██████████ as part of their investigation.

Hours later, ██████████ contacted me and advised me that ██████████ felt comfortable speaking with me over the phone.



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****Contact with (V1) [REDACTED]****

The following is a summary of my contact with [REDACTED] and is not verbatim. For more details, please refer to body worn camera footage.

[REDACTED] was driving the red Dodge Charger and [REDACTED] was the front passenger. They were parked (for approximately ten minutes) on 11th Ave, just south of Southern Ave, facing Southern Ave. The vehicle was not running. The suspect vehicle, which [REDACTED] believed at the time to be a marked Police vehicle, turned southbound on 11th Ave from Southern Ave, driving towards [REDACTED] vehicle. The suspect vehicle flashed its high beams at [REDACTED] while driving by his vehicle. As [REDACTED] turned his vehicle and headlights on, he noticed the suspect vehicle made a U-Turn from southbound 11th Ave to northbound 11th Ave, behind [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] began driving northbound on 11th Ave, approaching Southern Ave, at which point he observed red and blue lights displayed from the suspect vehicle. [REDACTED] did not hear an audible siren.

[REDACTED] turned left onto westbound Southern Ave, then turned right onto northbound 19th Ave, while the suspect vehicle continued to follow behind his, with the red and blue lights displayed. There was still no audible siren heard. [REDACTED] turned right onto eastbound Broadway Rd from 19th Ave, at which point he heard a brief audible siren. [REDACTED] then stopped in the curb lane of Broadway Rd, in between the bus stop and 17th Ave. The suspect vehicle's front bumper tapped the Dodge Charger's rear bumper. Once stopped, the suspect vehicle turned the red and blue lights off.

Two suspects exited the suspect vehicle. S1 approached [REDACTED] driver window and S2 approached [REDACTED] front passenger window. S1 and S2 immediately tried to open [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] doors. S1 yelled at [REDACTED] to exit the vehicle, while trying to open [REDACTED] door. S2 threatened to smash [REDACTED] window. At this time, [REDACTED] window was rolled down approximately 1/2 inch, and [REDACTED] window was rolled up.

S1 told [REDACTED] to turn the vehicle off and put his hands on the steering wheel. [REDACTED] cracked his window open a little more, at which point S1 grabbed [REDACTED] window and pulled it out. S1 then reached into the vehicle and unlocked the driver's door. S1 leaned in and tried to remove [REDACTED] seatbelt, while [REDACTED] is holding onto [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was yelling at S1, telling him that his actions were unlawful. [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] repeatedly ask S1 and S2 why they are being stopped.

S2 then opened [REDACTED] door and put her in an arm bar while she continued to hold onto [REDACTED]. S2 threatened to break [REDACTED] arm if [REDACTED] did not exit the vehicle. S2 realized [REDACTED] was not going to exit the vehicle, at which point he produced a taser and applied it to [REDACTED] right thigh. S2 pressed the taser against [REDACTED] thigh in a manner consistent with a stun-gun application and did not deploy any prongs. After tasing [REDACTED], S1 told S2 to put it on a "higher setting". S2 then applied the taser to [REDACTED] back. S2 pressed the taser against [REDACTED] back in a manner consistent with a stun-gun application and did not deploy any prongs. [REDACTED] was still being restrained in an arm bar by S2, while being tased.

[REDACTED] let go of [REDACTED] and she was pulled out of the car by S2. S2 handcuffed [REDACTED] behind her back and pushed her down onto the sidewalk. [REDACTED] was lying on her stomach, looking away from Broadway Rd, at a wall while [REDACTED] was being assaulted by S1 and S2. After approximately 5 minutes, [REDACTED] tried to get up and told S2 that she needed her phone from the passenger seat. S2 patted



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down, asked if she was in possession of a gun, then secured her in the rear passenger compartment of the suspect vehicle, directly behind the front passenger seat.

S1 advised he was going to be arrested for aggravated assault. reached for s phone to call for help and advised S1 he needed to call his mother. S1 reached for s phone in hand. During the struggle of S1 trying to retrieve the phone from , S1 pushed towards the backseat of the car. S1 told he was reaching for a knife. raised his hands and S1 told if he dropped his hands, he was going to shoot him. S1 tried pulling out of the vehicle by his left leg, causing ' left sneaker to fall off (later located on driver's floorboard).

While was handcuffed on the sidewalk, was being assaulted for approximately six minutes, during which he was repeatedly tased and punched. S2 began tasing from the front passenger side of the vehicle. S2 pressed the taser against body in a manner consistent with a stun-gun application and did not deploy any prongs. S2 tased on the right side of his body, near his ribs and arms. S1 punched in the head with a closed fist multiple times, striking his eyes, nose, and face. stated he was punched approximately seven times. was being tased and punched at the same time, while still holding s phone. S1 forcefully took s phone from hand and threw it on the ground on Broadway Rd.

S1 then pulled pieces of hair out, while yelling at to exit the vehicle. tried holding onto his vehicle, while being pulled out by S1 and tased by S2. S1 told S2 to continue tasing until does what he says. S2 continued tasing said, "okay" and S1 told him to exit. kept saying, "okay". S1 told "You're saying okay, but I'm not seeing a lot of moving," and S2 tased in his ribs.

S1 pulled the gun from his right hip, pointing it towards the ground. While waving the gun with the muzzle pointed towards the ground, S1 told he was going to shoot him in three seconds and began counting down.

described the handgun as two toned, muted light grey or silver in color with a silver flashlight on top. stated there was a striped pattern, horizontally across the slide.

said, "Wait wait wait," and began to exit the vehicle. While seated in the driver seat, placed his legs outside of the car. S2 told S1, "If he jumps out of the car or does anything stupid, shoot him." S1 told "I'm gonna shoot you in three seconds. 3, 2, 1," so exited the vehicle, standing in the open door. S1 told to put his hands behind his back and produced handcuffs. continued to repeat, "wait", then hopped back in the car and turned it on. S1 told that if he drove off, he was going to get shot. then sped away, eastbound on Broadway Rd.

drove eastbound Broadway Rd, southbound 7th Ave, eastbound Southern Ave, southbound Central Ave, eastbound Baseline Rd, northbound 7th St, eastbound Southern Ave, southbound Priest Dr to Baseline Rd, where his car overheated and became disabled. then walked to a family member's residence in Guadalupe. While driving away from the scene, did not see the suspect vehicle following.

Utilizing law enforcement databases, vehicle is observed traveling eastbound on Southern Ave at Clementine Dr at approximately 2359 hours.



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After [REDACTED] drove away, S2 released [REDACTED] from car and removed her handcuffs. The suspects told [REDACTED], "Why would he do that, he's probably going to get shot." S2 told [REDACTED] "We know where you live now." The suspects entered their vehicle and drove away, eastbound on Broadway Rd, in the direction of [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] walked back to [REDACTED] apartment, where [REDACTED] answered the front door for [REDACTED], while she was on the phone with me.

[REDACTED] later logged into her Google account and tracked her cellphone to the Salt River wash, near the scene. [REDACTED] factory reset her phone, out of fear the suspects would use it to find where she resides.

****Suspect Vehicle****

[REDACTED] described the suspect vehicle as a white, older model SUV, with a blue stripe. [REDACTED] stated the vehicle was larger than a Ford Expedition. [REDACTED] stated the blue stripe looked like the design on the older model Phoenix Police Chevy Tahoe's, but stated the stripe was "too skinny" to be a Phoenix Police vehicle, recognizing the blue stripe on Phoenix Police vehicles is thicker. [REDACTED] also stated he did not see the rising Phoenix bird logo on the suspect vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the suspect vehicle said "POLICE" in white letters, on the blue stripe. When asked if the vehicle had "POLICE" decals, or whether it appeared that "POLICE" decals had been removed, leaving a faded "POLICE" outline on the vehicle, [REDACTED] stated there were "POLICE" stickers on the suspect vehicle.

[REDACTED] did not think the suspect vehicle had a front bush bar. The vehicle had black rims, two spotlights, and a long light bar on top of the vehicle. [REDACTED] stated the spotlights were on during the traffic stop. When asked if the red and blue lights were displayed from the light bar on top of the vehicle, or from inside the windshield, [REDACTED] stated he was unsure.

[REDACTED] stated when she was sitting in the rear right passenger seat of the suspect vehicle, the seats were hard, not soft or cushioned like normal vehicles. There were no bars covering the windows, however a partition with metal bars (mesh pattern) and plastic window separated her seating area from the vehicle's front seating compartment. The mesh pattern of the partition was directly behind the driver seat and front passenger seat, and the window was in the middle. There were no handles on the inside of the passenger doors. [REDACTED] observed an open laptop with the screen visible, possibly a map/GPS, near the front passenger seat. [REDACTED] observed a radio near the center of the front passenger compartment and heard radio traffic. [REDACTED] heard a woman's voice over the radio say, "You guys are down at 19th? What's the situation over there? Do you need backup?" [REDACTED] did not hear anything further being said over the radio and did not hear any beeping/channel marker noises from the radio. [REDACTED] drew a picture of what the inside of the suspect vehicle looked like. This photograph was uploaded to Evidence.com.

The suspect vehicle description provided is consistent with a white, older model Police SUV (possibly Chevy Tahoe), sold at an auction. The suspect vehicle description is similar to an older model DPS, Goodyear, Chandler or Scottsdale Police Chevy Tahoe.

****Suspect 1 Description****

S1 is described as a heavy-set Hispanic male, approximately 5'10"-6', approximately 25-30's years old, short black curly hair, with a goatee and beard, thick eyebrows, acne and acne scarring, wearing rectangular prescription glasses. S1 was wearing cologne, which [REDACTED] believed smelled like Old Spice



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Swagger. [REDACTED] did not observe any tattoos or piercings. S1 was not wearing gloves and did not have any face coverings. S1 spoke English.

S1 was wearing all black clothing, thin black long sleeve shirt, black slacks/cargo pants, and grey/black Sketchers work shoes. S1 was wearing a black outer carrier vest, with a grey star on the left breast pocket, and a square body worn camera on the center of the vest. The body camera was not on. The grey star was plain, with no words, markings, or symbols surrounding it. [REDACTED] stated the grey star did not resemble a sheriff's badge star. There was no radio, taser, or other tools affixed to the outer carrier vest. During the incident, S1 told S2 that he did not have a taser. There were no "Police" patches on the vest and no Police patches on either shoulder of the long sleeve. S1 was wearing a belt with a gun on his right hip. During the incident, S1 produced handcuffs and waved them at [REDACTED], which [REDACTED] believes may have been from S1's belt.

****Suspect 2 Description****

S2 is described as a skinny Middle Eastern or Indian male, approximately 5'10"-6' (shorter than S1), approximately 25-30's years old, with short brown wavy hair (comb over), stubble facial hair, and thinner eyebrows. [REDACTED] did not observe any tattoos or piercings. S2 was not wearing gloves and did not have any face coverings. S2 spoke English.

S2 was wearing all blue clothing, a long blue sleeve shirt, blue slacks/cargo pants, and black dress shoes. S2 was wearing a blue outer carrier vest, with a grey star on the left breast pocket. The grey star was plain, with no words, markings, or symbols surrounding it. [REDACTED] stated the grey star did not resemble a sheriff's badge star. There was no body camera, radio, taser, or other tools affixed to the outer carrier vest. S2 was holding a taser that was blue with a yellow stripe down the middle. There were no "Police" patches on the vest and no Police patches on either shoulder of the long sleeve. [REDACTED] did not see a belt on S2.

Due to this incident occurring within the jurisdiction of Phoenix at 19th Ave/Broadway Rd, Phoenix Police was notified and ultimately took disposition of this investigation (Phoenix PD 26-1085250).

Officer D. Dominguez #9777 contacted me by phone, and I provided him with this information. I advised Officer Dominguez that the Dodge Charger was currently impounded at the secure Apache Sands Towing parking lot (1600 N Delaware St, Chandler) and had not been processed for evidence. I advised Officer Dominguez that [REDACTED] would like the vehicle to be processed for evidence and desires to retrieve her vehicle from the tow yard to avoid daily impound fees. I advised Officer Dominguez that [REDACTED] understands if the vehicle is going to be processed for evidence, she cannot pick up the vehicle from the tow yard prior to evidence processing, due to contaminating the evidence. I advised Officer Dominguez that [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] had also retained their clothing for collection by Phoenix Police for evidence processing.

Officer Dominguez advised me that Phoenix Police would not be responding to Apache Sands to process the vehicle and would not be towing the vehicle to a secure Phoenix Police location for processing. Officer Dominguez advised me that Phoenix Police Detectives would use their discretion in determining whether to process the vehicle for evidence. Officer Dominguez advised me that he attempted to make contact with [REDACTED] and [REDACTED] at [REDACTED] however [REDACTED] father answered the door and advised him they were asleep.



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This concludes my involvement reference this incident. My investigation was audio and video recorded using body worn camera and footage was uploaded to Evidence.com.

I am an operator assigned to the Tempe Police Department's Real-Time Operations Center (RTOC). The RTOC is a technology-based operational support unit that assists police officers, fire personnel, and other first responders by providing real-time information and situational awareness during calls for service and other public safety incidents. In addition to supporting active calls for service, RTOC operators may assist with locating video or other digital evidence related to criminal investigations and providing information to investigators and command staff when requested.

RTOC operators utilize available systems and resources to review relevant information associated with incidents, access city-operated camera systems when appropriate, and relay observations or other pertinent details to responding personnel and supervisors. These functions assist field units in developing situational awareness and understanding evolving circumstances during an incident.

The purpose of the Real-Time Operations Center is to support public safety operations by providing timely information, improving coordination between responding units, and enhancing the overall safety and effectiveness of emergency response.

Narrative / Actions Taken:

While working as a member of the Tempe Police Department Real Time Operations Center (RTOC), I assisted with this incident.

Upon hearing of the original information, I utilized available video streams in RTOC, to review/monitor camera footage for this incident. My observations of this incident were strictly viewed through the video stream which was uploaded to the Evidence.com website. See the evidence record overview for date and times of capture and impound. Refer to the video for details of my observations.
