One Month Update: Michigan Recovery by the Numbers

LANSING – Just one month since [President Trump announced the federal disaster declaration](#) for the state of Michigan following the April 10 – 21, 2026, severe storms, tornadoes and flooding, Michiganders have received **\$12.3 million** in federal assistance to support their disaster recovery efforts.

As of July 30, the state's recovery—led by [Michigan State Police – Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division](#)—includes the following milestones:

- Nearly **\$10.9 million** in FEMA's Individual and Households Program (IHP) grants awarded to more than **1,500** eligible homeowners and renters in [27 Michigan counties](#). These grants help pay for uninsured and underinsured losses and disaster-related damage, including:
 - More than **\$6.2 million** in FEMA housing grants to help pay for home repair, home replacement and rental assistance for temporary housing.
 - More than **\$4.6 million** in Other Needs Assistance grants to help pay for personal property replacement and other serious storm-related needs—such as moving and storage fees, transportation, childcare, and medical and dental expenses.
- More than **\$1.4 million** in long-term, low-interest disaster loans has been approved by the U.S. Small Business Administration to help homeowners and renters, businesses and nonprofit organizations repair, rebuild or replace disaster-damaged physical property, and to cover economic injury for businesses of all sizes and nonprofit organizations.
- In addition, more than **\$5.3 million** in National Flood Insurance Program flood insurance claims have been paid to date.
- The state of Michigan has also established **11** recovery centers across the state that have offered nearly **700** Michiganders one-on-one support as they navigate the assistance process.

Reminder: Application Deadline is August 31, 2026

If you are insured, file an insurance claim first, then apply for FEMA assistance for unmet needs. Start the FEMA application process by going online to [DisasterAssistance.gov](#) or calling the FEMA Helpline at 800-621-3362. If you use video relay service, captioned telephone service or others, give FEMA your number for that service.

Apply for a low-interest loan from the SBA by visiting [SBA.gov/disaster](#). Note: the deadline to apply for a loan for physical damage is August 31, 2026 and the economic injury loan application deadline is March 30, 2027.
