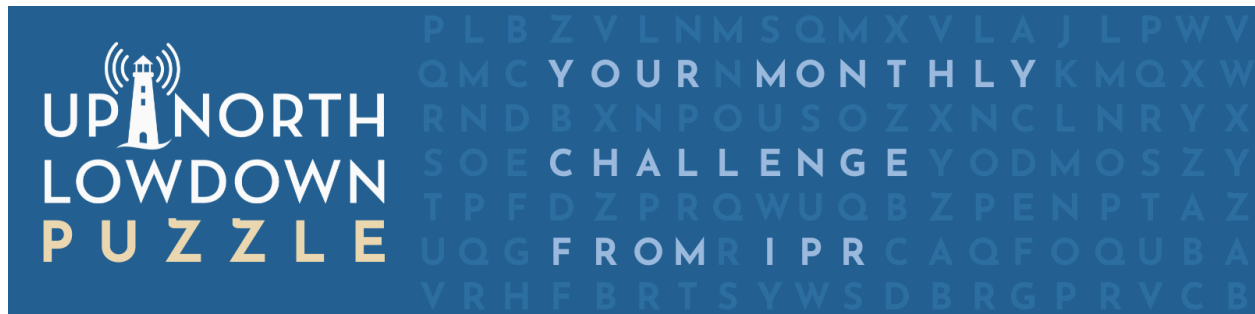




What is the Up North Lowdown Puzzle?

How do I play?

[Subscribe to the IPR newsletter](#) (it's free!) and you'll get a link to the game every month. Read through the puzzle and fill out the Google form on the same page.

Can I send the link to a friend?

Sure, but you should encourage them to sign up for the newsletter too, so they get it every month all on their own!

How do I win, and then what happens?

The winner is chosen randomly from among the people who gave correct answers each week. We'll get in touch with you Thursday at noon, and will play a game with you right on the phone. That gets recorded and aired Friday morning. And we'll send you some IPR merch.

Are there any rules?

Anyone is eligible to play, except for IPR employees and the immediate members of their households. Oh, and you can only win once per year.
