twenty different nations join the voyage of the 12,000-ton Polarstern icebreaker as it's gripped by the polar ice and drifts for an entire year.

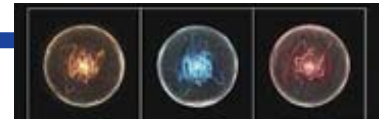

The voyage was long and dangerous, and only one ship returned home three years later. Although it was laden with valuable spices from the East, only 18 of the fleet's original crew of 270 returned with the ship.

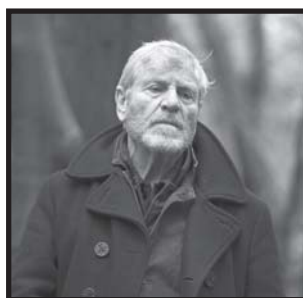

American Masters Becoming Helen Keller

"Becoming Helen Keller" on **American Masters** revisits Keller's rich career and explores how she perpetually put her celebrity to use to advocate for human rights in the pursuit of social justice, particularly for women, the poor and people with disabilities. Taking her from the poorhouses and segregated blind and deaf schools of her 19th century childhood to worldwide celebrity, the film brings Keller's story vividly to life from her point of view and from the perspectives of those who knew her.

The film reveals the social obstacles Keller regularly encountered, the progressive reforms she helped achieve, and why pushing the boundaries of human rights for people with disabilities in the late 20th century required a different approach. Our story reminds us that we are always building upon the past as we seek a sustainable future.

Angels on Horseback: Midwives in the Mountains

Recognizing the dreadful lack of medical resources for more than 10,000 people living in isolated areas of eastern Kentucky, Mary Breckinridge founded the Frontier Nursing Service (FNS) in 1925. Born into one of the most illustrious Kentucky families in 1881, Breckinridge used her family's contacts to raise over \$6 million to establish the FNS, which brought New York-trained nurse-midwives to Appalachia at a time Appalachia had the highest mortality rates in the U.S.

Mounted on horseback and armed with saddlebags of medical supplies, the nurse-midwives traveled the winding mountain roads and trails to provide medical care to women and children.

Lowering the region's mortality rates below the national average, not only did Breckinridge introduce nurse-midwifery to the United States, her model was used across the country to revitalize women's health care and continues today in high poverty areas.

Rita Moreno: Just a Girl Who Decided to Go For It

Over a career spanning more than 70 years, Rita Moreno defied both her humble upbringing and relentless racism to become a celebrated and award-winning actor. **American Masters** explores the star's rich, decades-long career.

Born into poverty on a Puerto Rican farm, Moreno and her seamstress mother immigrated to New York City when Moreno was five years old. After studying dance and performing on Broadway, Moreno was cast as any ethnic minority the Hollywood studios needed filled.



Despite becoming the first Latina actress to win an Academy Award for her role as Anita in "West Side Story" (1961), the studios continued to offer Moreno lesser roles as stereotypical ethnic minorities, ignoring her proven talent.

José Lezama Lima, legendary poet and writer, considered one of most influential figures in Latin American literature in the 20th century. His life story is told through letters written to

his sister Eloisa, living in exile in the U.S. between 1961 and 1976. He seems to have poured out his heart, his trials and his doubts to her. "If there is no freedom there is no poetry," he writes to her in one.

Born in 1910, Lima was raised in an upper-class family that scraped by in genteel poverty. Asthmatic and sickly, he retreated from the island's chaotic, corrupt public life to literature and poetry, and founded an idealistic, influential cultural journal, *Origines*, which lasted from 1944-1956.

The film is a first-hand look at the transformative impact of politics on the family and society. It shows the struggle between Cuba's revolutionary government and artists and intellectuals, as the space for creative freedom disappeared in Cuba during the first two decades of the revolution.

The American Psychiatric Association's *Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders* listed homosexuality as a "sociopathic personality disturbance" in its first edition, published in 1952, and as a "sexual deviation" and "non-psychotic mental disorder" in its second edition, published in 1968.

"Cured" on **Independent Lens** illuminates a pivotal yet largely unknown chapter in the struggle for LGBTQ equality: the campaign that led the American Psychiatric Association (APA) to remove homosexuality from its manual of mental illnesses. Before this momentous 1973 decision, the medical establishment viewed every gay and lesbian person as diseased and in need of a cure. Business and government used the mental-illness

classification to justify discrimination and bigotry. As long as lesbians and gay men were "sick," progress toward equality was nearly impossible.

"Cured" takes audiences inside this riveting narrative to chronicle the strategy and tactics that led to this crucial turning point in the movement for LGBTQ rights.

While "Cured" is indisputably about science, medicine, politics, and the process of social change, this film at its core is about a group of extraordinary activists with stubborn dedication and big personalities who came together at a crossroads in LGBTQ history.

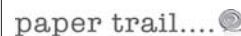

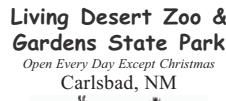

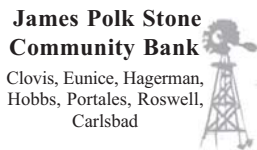
