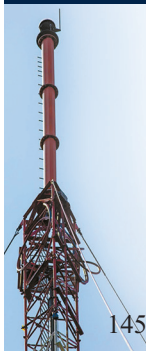
Freeport Speech and Prescott Park events!

First up, on June 1, we celebrate the United States' Semiquincentennial with a special **Antiques Roadshow: 250 Years of Americana** followed by our own **Assignment Maine: America @ 250**. On June 4, we'll bring you the **High School Quiz Show: Maine Season 9 Championship**. Tune in to see which Maine high school comes out on top! Also that night,

it's a new episode of **Learning From Maine**, showcasing innovation, joy, and triumph in Maine classrooms.

On Sunday, June 14, we begin the 11th and final season of **Grantchester on Masterpiece** which will bring everyone back for a drama-filled summer in 1963. After a decade of faith, friendship, and murder, how can we possibly say goodbye to this series? A beloved series is wrapping things up right where it started – in a quiet English village that, truth be told, has never been all that quiet. It's a place where a vicar and a cop solve crimes – and carry each other through whatever life throws their way.

It's the momentous summer of 1963. Police

detective Geordie Keating (Robson Green) and vicar Alphy Kottaram (Rishi Nair) face their greatest challenges yet. From a killing at a drive-in movie to corruption within the Church, and a baffling Agatha Christie-style locked-room mystery on a train, the shocking crimes continue. Viewers will also see stories concluded for other favorite characters: Leonard Finch, Mrs. C, Cathy Keating, Larry Peters and Miss Scott. In the final season, everyone will question the paths they are on, and some huge decisions will be made. The Grantchester family must face love, loss, and forgiveness one last time. ■

We provide two distinct radio formats: news/information and classical music, including seven new FM signals in 2025, and four free over-the-air television channels: Maine Public Television, Create, World, and PBS Kids. We offer online platforms, a robust YouTube channel and social media presence, and we also serve as Maine's Emergency Alert System (EAS).

This year brought an unexpected challenge: the ongoing loss of federal funding for public media. Our donors stepped up in a big way — more than 9,000 new members have joined since the news broke, and more than 7,000 Evergreen Friends have increased their monthly support. Our supporters' remarkable response is helping address the immediate funding crisis and sustained support will keep Maine Public on track as we adjust to this new reality.

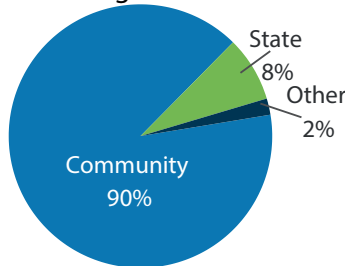

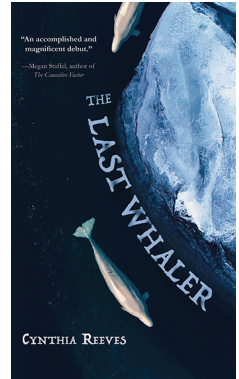
The Last Whaler this June

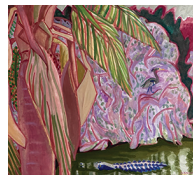
