Dear Senator Fenberg,

It is time for the 2023 Appropriations Preference Poll!

Below you will find **four links** that are all **unique to you (so do not forward this email!)**. You will use each link to select the bills that you prefer in each category.

Bills are split into four distinct categories:

1. Bills that have **ongoing** General Fund expenditures
2. Bills with **“low dollar” ongoing** General Fund expenditures (below \$250k)
3. Bills that **reduce General Fund revenue or impact TABOR refunds**
4. Bills that spend **one time** General Fund dollars

The JBC set aside **\$30 million** in the budget for ongoing General Fund commitments. The “ongoing” and the “low dollar ongoing” categories will pull from this set aside. Importantly, the list only includes bills that impact the General Fund, either directly through revenue/expenditures or indirectly through TABOR refund impacts, while bills with de minimis General Fund impacts (less than \$25K) are not included.

The results of this preference poll are a data point that will help identify caucus priorities. As bills continue to make their way through the legislative process, we expect future policy changes may affect a bill’s fiscal note, meaning these results will not guarantee funding at a certain level.

Instructions:

We will be utilizing a quadratic data collection process to understand your preferences. The quadratic data collection model is used for collective decision making in which individuals can express both support for an issue and the intensity of that support.

For each category, you will receive 99 credits. You will then choose the bills that you wish to prioritize by making a "support click" on that bill. If you strongly prefer a certain bill, you can make more than one "support click," but each additional click will cost more credits than the previous click. For example, one support click costs one credit, two support clicks costs four credits, three support clicks costs nine credits, etc. The table below shows the quadratic nature of making more than one support click.
