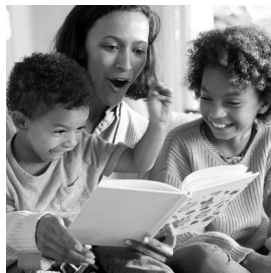

Sounds Around Town Wraps for the Summer

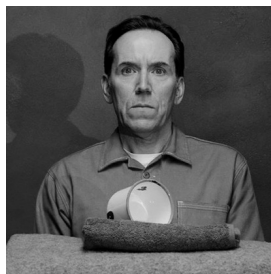

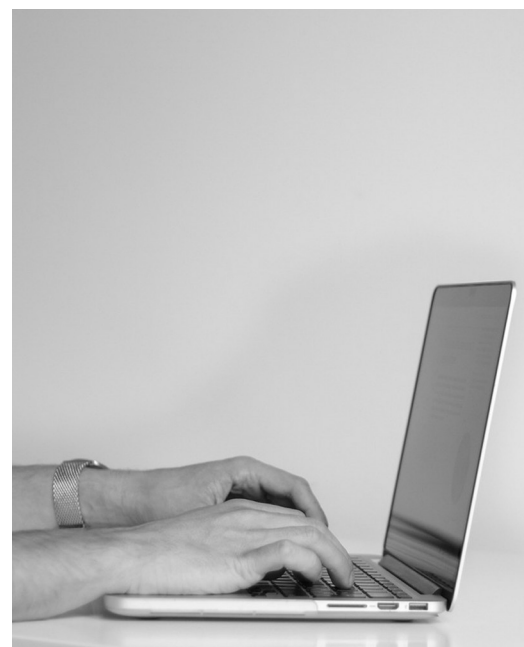
