


Major Winter Storm Approaching

Significant Impacts Are Anticipated - December 22-24, 2022

RADAR FORECAST SHOWING PRECIPITATION TYPE & TIMING



- Increased risk for "flash freeze" across SE Lower MI: Rainwater will freeze in place tonight
- Snow + wind gusts over 40 mph will lead to blizzard conditions for many areas
- Areas downwind of Lakes Superior and Michigan may not stop snowing until Christmas Day



What Changed Since Yesterday?

Winter Storm: December 22-24, 2022

Key Forecast Differences From What Was Briefed Yesterday

- → Flash freeze expected to be more impactful across SE Lower MI late tonight (water quickly freezing)
- → Increased snow amounts across northern Lower MI
- → Similar impacts to 2011 blizzard now more focused in areas with a Blizzard Warning

Key Items That Haven't Changed

- → Strong wind gusts of 40-50 mph inland and up to 60 mph along the lakeshore regions
- → Power outages continue to be possible
- → Periods of heavy snow and blizzard conditions making for dangerous and treacherous travel
- → Continued risk for deep snow drifts developing in open areas
- → Plunging temperatures, beginning later today, and lasting into early next week



Multiple Hazards from the Storm

December 22-24, 2022

Precipitation

- → Upper Peninsula: Lake Effect Snow Tonight Through Sunday Morning
- → Northern Lower Peninsula: Snow Today through Friday, Lake Effect Snow Saturday into Sunday AM
- → Southern Lower Peninsula
 - ◆ **SE Michigan:** Rain this evening with a flash freeze tonight. Snow late tonight into Saturday.
 - ◆ **SW Michigan:** Rain/snow mix this evening quickly turns to snow tonight. Lake Effect Friday/Saturday.

Winds

- → Statewide: 40 mph or higher Friday, with > 50 mph gusts across SE Lower MI. Saturday 30-40 mph.
- → Blowing Snow: Snow + Strong Winds = Dangerous travel. Some travel may be impossible in certain areas.
- → Near Lake Superior & Lake Michigan: Occasional gusts of 50-60 mph Friday, lower on Saturday

Cold


- → Temperatures: Teens for Highs Friday through Sunday, Low Temperatures in the Single Digits
- → Wind Chills: Near and Below Zero Friday into Sunday





Snowfall Probabilities


Now Through Christmas Eve

Key Takeaways


- → Impactful snow + dangerous travel statewide
- → Lowest across mid Michigan/south central Lower
- → Highest near coasts + Upper Peninsula
- → Major metro areas:
 - Detroit: 3"-6" with blowing snow
 - Grand Rapids: 10"-16" with blizzard conditions
 - ◆ Lansing: 6"-8" with blowing snow
 - Kalamazoo: 10"-16" with blizzard conditions
- → 12"-24" expected for most of our lakeshore region
- → Actual snowfall will be difficult to measure!





Maximum Wind Gust Forecast

The Highest Winds Will Occur on Friday...But Gusty Conditions Continue Saturday



Key Takeaways

- → Gusts > 40 mph expected statewide Friday
- → Gusts > 50 mph possible SE Lower MI + coastlines
- → Worst of the winds expected all day Friday
- → Saturday gusts still 30-40 mph
- → Some power outages are likely to occur

Recommended that Travel be Completed As Soon As Possible Thursday

Dangerous Travel Conditions Statewide Friday into Saturday

- → Travel may not even be possible particularly near the coasts of Lakes Superior and Michigan
- → Snow drifts may have a particularly high impact on these major roads:
 - ◆ US 41, M-28, US 31, US 131, I-196 from Grand Rapids westward, and I-94 near/west of Kalamazoo
- → If travel is essential, we recommend packing emergency items to keep you safe
- → Realize that if you are stranded, help may not come right away

Recovery/Return to Normal - Could be Slower than Typical

- → Depends a lot on how much snow, how much drifting, when winds subside and how cold impacts recovery
- → Weather overall improves Sunday, though below freezing temperatures settle in for much of the week





Below Freezing Temperatures Monday until at least Wednesday

- → Highs Monday and Tuesday in the teens and 20s, Warming into upper 20s to low 30s Wednesday
- → Lows Monday through Wednesday in the single digits and teens

Additional Significant Snow or Strong Winds are Not Expected

- → Wind Chills should be near or slightly below zero through Tuesday
- → Some light accumulations of snow possible, widespread impacts not expected
