PERFORMERS

Grammy-nominated Baritone Joshua Conyers has been heralded by the New York Times and Washington Post for his deliciously honeyed, sonorous baritone and show stealing performance quality in both new and standard operatic works, as well as on concert stages. Mr. Conyers has performed with The Metropolitan Opera, Seattle Opera, Washington National Opera, Lyric Opera of Chicago, English National Opera, New York Philharmonic, and National Symphony Orchestra. As a concert soloist and recitalist, he has sung at Carnegie Hall and other venues internationally. His recordings include his debut solo album, A Miracle Legacy with Lexicon Classics, as well as features on the Grammy Nominated album X: The Life and Times of Malcolm X by Anthony Davis, and in Bernstein, Gershwin, & Copland: Works with Naxos.

A native of Bronx, NY, Conyers' dedication and vision as an artist, educator, and advocate strives to propel the performing arts industry forward. In addition to giving masterclasses and seminars at universities and organizations around the world, Joshua is active in the community as a member of the Young Professionals Advisory Board of the Newark Boys Chorus School, mentoring underserved young men of color who find their paths through music. Previously, Mr. Conyers taught voice at the New England Conservatory Preparatory School and Continuing Education. Joshua received his BM in Vocal Performance and Professional Artist Certificate from the UNC School of the Arts/A.J. Fletcher Opera Institute, and his MM in Vocal Performance from Indiana University

Collaborative pianist and vocal coach **Dr. Chelsea Whitaker** enjoys a diverse career in the vocal arts, currently serving as Assistant Professor of Vocal Coaching at the Eastman School of Music. Passionate about American art song, particularly that of living composers, she has worked with composers including John Harbison, Jake Heggie, John Musto, Ben Moore, and Paul Moravec. Whitaker has performed in venues including the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Merkin Hall, and Jordan Hall. Dr. Whitaker holds degrees from the University of Missouri, Kansas City, University of Southern California, and New England Conservatory. Her primary instructors have been Cameron Stowe, Jonathan Feldman, Alan Smith, and Robert Weirich.

Prior to her appointment at Eastman, Whitaker served on faculty at New England Conservatory, where she taught and coached in the voice and opera departments. Previous work has included performances with Sparks and Wiry Cries, Cincinnati Song Initiative, and Boston Art Song Society; vocal coaching and staff pianist positions at Boston University Tanglewood Institute, University of Massachusetts, Amherst, and Boston University; and music director positions with Boston Opera Collaborative.
