

Examine the issues facing the planet's most threatened ecosystems. Join conservation scientist Dr. M. Sanjayan in the third year of this seven-year project for a global environmental health check of one of Earth's seven bellwether biomes. These vulnerable habitats are changing, revealing surprising animal behaviors as species adapt. In this special, Dr. Sanjayan visits the Maldives to take an in-depth look at coral reefs and the urgent efforts to help them survive climate change.

NOVA: Great American Eclipse

Explore the spectacular cosmic phenomenon of a total solar eclipse. On April 8, the moon's shadow will sweep across Erie. Locations in the path of totality will plunge into darkness for approximately four minutes. Learn how to watch the eclipse safely and follow scientists as they work to unlock the secrets of our Sun. Explore why its atmosphere is hundreds of times hotter than its surface. What causes solar storms, and how we might predict them?
