

High School Quiz Show: Maine returns for its 9th season to Maine Public Television on Thursday, March 19, with an all-new season of academic competition! Each episode premieres on Maine Public Television, MainePublic.org, and the Maine Public App on Thursdays starting at 8:00 p.m. and are rebroadcast on Fridays at 2:00 p.m. and Sundays at 5:00 p.m. Once aired, each episode is available at mainepublic.org every Thursday evening.

High School Quiz Show: Maine is a locally produced television production hosted by Todd Gutner, pictured below and on the cover, and led by producer Nick Woodward pitting four-student teams from Maine high schools against each other in a single-elimination, academic bracket competition. Questions used in each contest align with the Maine high school curriculum standards across literature, history, science and math as well as including questions regarding current events and general knowledge. Each episode will feature video questions from notable civic and business leaders in Maine.

The winning team will receive a \$1,000 gift to their school's Project Graduation with the runner-up being awarded a \$500 gift.

Whether you're a longtime fan wanting to relive the Crowley saga or a newcomer wondering what all the fuss is about, all six seasons are available for you to enjoy.

On Maine Public Television, we'll bring you a special episode of **Sound Waves** on March 5 featuring previously unseen performances and interviews. You'll have an opportunity to rewatch the first two Coastal Maine Botanical Gardens episodes of **Antiques Roadshow** on March 2 and 9. The third episode in the Maine series will premiere on March 23. **High School Quiz Show: Maine** Season 9 premieres on March 19. On Sunday, March 22, it's a night of new drama with the Season 15 premiere of **Call the Midwife** followed by two new **Masterpiece** series, **The Forsytes** and **The Count of Monte Cristo**. **The Forsytes** chronicles the trials and triumphs of a wealthy Victorian stockbroking family, whose generations find themselves torn between tradition and the personal pursuit of happiness. And **The Count of Monte Cristo**, is an epic new TV adaptation of Alexandre Dumas' iconic French novel, one of the greatest revenge stories ever told.

We'll bring you a new three-part series from Executive Producer Ken Burns: **Henry David Thoreau** on March 30 and 31. In this modern take on the historical documentary, the mythical Thoreau will give way to the human Thoreau. On Maine Public Radio, we'll bring you highlights from the **2026 Camden Conference on Speaking in Maine** (start date TBD at the time of writing). The theme of this year's conference, "Today's Middle East: Power, Politics & Players" explores how traditional and emerging powers are reshaping relationships and testing alliances across this globally vital region.

Henry David Thoreau

Henry David Thoreau helped define modern environmentalism and nonviolent resistance, yet his life has been obscured by myth. The author of *Walden* and *Civil Disobedience* was brilliant but flawed, idealistic but opinionated. A writer, scientist and activist, his words resonate urgently with today's challenges as humanity looks for ways to live in harmony with nature – and each

other. A new three-part series produced by Ken Burns and Don Henley examines the life and work of the 19th-century writer. He is seen in the context of antebellum New England and the larger United States as well as through the universal themes he focused on in his writings: an individual's relationship to the state, how to live an authentic life, our connection to nature, and the impact of race on American life. Set against the social tensions of the mid-19th century, the film traces Thoreau's journey from his early days in Concord, Massachusetts, to his deep engagement with the moral crises of his time, including industrialization, slavery, war, and environmental degradation. ■

A Centennial Road Trip**

Maine filmmaker Bob Krist goes on a road trip along the entire length of Route One in Maine from the south to the north. He is looking for those “stubborn and authentic people, places, and traditions that make Route One more of a vital artery, and not just a line on a map.” Along the way, he explores an antique car museum, observes the world’s largest rotating globe, visits the world’s tallest bridge observatory, travels the length of Maine’s unique Solar System, and explores the Acadian culture of the Madawaska area before ending the trip in Fort Kent.

The Forsytes | 9:00 pm: Money and society dictate the rules in rapidly-changing Victorian London, where four generations of the wealthy Forsyte family of stockbrokers navigate high-risk investments and the even higher expectations of making the right marital match. In this reimagining of John Galsworthy’s *Forsyte* novels, desire, ambition, and betrayal all boil down to the eternal dilemma: should one be ruled by the head or the heart? With sumptuous period costumes and a lavish set, the series will bring viewers into a family of rivals and lovers, sons and wives, artists and tycoons! The sweeping and stellar cast features Francesca Annis as formidable Forsyte matriarch Ann, with Stephen Moyer as eldest son Jolyon Senior, head of the family stockbroking firm. Danny Griffin plays his bohemian son Jo, Tuppence Middleton is Jo’s queen of high society wife, Frances, and Eleanor Tomlinson plays Louisa Byrne, a Soho dressmaker.

The Count of Monte Cristo | 10:00 pm: Based on the classic French adventure novel by Alexandre Dumas, the story is centered around betrayal, revenge, and redemption. Sam Claflin stars as Edmond Dantès, a nineteen-year-old sailor who arrives home from the sea expecting to wed his beloved Mercedes, but a trio of unforeseen enemies derail his plans and future. On the eve of his wedding, he is falsely accused of treason and imprisoned, without trial, in a grim island fortress off Marseille, France. As Edmond loses hope in prison, he meets Abbé Faria, a priest who reveals to Edmond the location of a legendary treasure hidden on the island of Monte Cristo. Edmond finally escapes and finds the treasure, making him one of the richest men in the world. Under the identity of the Count of Monte Cristo, he sets out to take revenge on those who wrongly accused him. ■
