DEADLY ALLIANCE Leopold and Loeb AMERICAN STORIES

In 1924, two brilliant, wealthy teenagers from Chicago's elite shocked the nation by committing a cold-blooded murder—just to see if they could get away with it.

Prohibition

Ken Burns and Lynn Novick's Prohibition, a three-part, six-hour documentary series, tells the sweeping story of one of America's most ambitious and ultimately disastrous social experiments.

When Prohibition went into effect in 1920, it aimed to reduce alcohol abuse and strengthen families. Instead, it turned millions of Americans into lawbreakers overnight. People brewed moonshine at home, speakeasies thrived, and by the late 1920s, the U.S. had become the world's largest importer of cocktail shakers.

The law's consequences were far-reaching. Organized crime flourished, law enforcement was overwhelmed and often corrupted, and for the first time, plea bargaining became common to manage overcrowded courts. Rather than promoting temperance, Prohibition fueled excess.

Economically, the damage was severe. Thousands of jobs vanished as breweries and saloons shut down. States like New York lost major revenue—up to 75% of it had come from liquor taxes. Nationally, the federal government lost \$11 billion in tax revenue and spent over \$300 million trying to enforce the law.

Intended to elevate the moral fabric of the nation, Prohibition instead exposed deep divisions and raised difficult questions about the role of government and morality. By 1933, the 18th Amendment was repealed, marking the end of an eraand the beginning of a new caution in how America enshrines values into law.



Hardhat Riot



The documentary offers a searing, focused look at a pivotal moment when patriotism, labor identity, and dissent collided.

AM≋RICAN EXPERIENCE. FDR

This absorbing American Experience presentation explores the life and enduring significance of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, the only U.S. president to serve more than two terms. Through a sweeping multi-part narrative, it charts his transformation from



privileged scion to a resilient, inspirational leader who steered the nation through the Great Depression and World War II.

The two-part, four and a half-hour film reveals how FDR reshaped American society—crafting a lasting social safety net and redefining presidential leadership—with a mix of rare archival footage, expert commentary, and interviews. It examines his struggle with polio and how adversity forged his national resolve, as well as the political battles and bold decisions that left a profound historical imprint.

Clocking in at just over four hours in total runtime, this multi-part series offers both historical depth and narrative clarity, illuminating the man behind the legacy and the era he helped define.

BIG CATS 24/7 - Season 2

Season 2 of Big Cats 24/7 takes viewers deep into Botswana's Okavango Delta as a team of wildlife filmmakers spends six months tracking lions, leopards, and cheetahs continuously—day and night. Across six episodes, audiences follow individual big cats as they navigate wildfires, floods, and fierce competition for survival in a transforming landscape.

Using breakthrough low-light cameras, drones, and long-term observation, the series captures rare nocturnal hunts, cub-rearing hardships, and territorial battles in vivid detail. Highlights include rogue male lions staking claims, lioness mothers defending cubs from intruders, and cheetah families teaching their young to hunt—all set amid shifting prey populations and extreme weather patterns.

Each episode charts a critical arc in the cats' lives, building narrative momentum and

Human

"Human" on Nova is a stunning fivepart documentary series hosted by paleoanthropologist Ella Al-Shamahi. Spanning 300,000 years, it traces the extraordinary story of how Homo sapiens rose from being one of many human species to the only one left—and how that story shapes who we are today.

When our species emerged in Africa, we were not alone. At least six other human species roamed the Earth, from the tool-making Homo erectus to the mysterious Denisovans and the diminutive Homo floresiensis, known as "The Hobbit." Using groundbreaking fossil discoveries, ancient DNA analysis, and cinematic reenactments, the series reconstructs how we outlasted them all.

Each episode focuses on a pivotal chapter: our origins in Africa, our journey across the globe, the extinction of our sister species, the peopling of the Americas, and finally, the gamble of permanent settlement. From 10-foot-tall Ice Age bears to the invention of the alphabet in a Sinai desert mine, the series brings our prehistory vividly to life.



The documentary highlights Orozco's influence on generations of artists-from Thomas Hart Benton to the Chicano mural movement—and frames his border-crossing career as emblematic of immigrant resilience.
