PODCAST SERIES: DETENTION BY DESIGN

Detention By Design is a six-episode series that is equal parts domestic and international in scope. In it, we meet dictators of all stripes; people who risked lives trying to find freedom; politicians confronted with difficult realities; and attorneys and activists who fought for the Land of the Free to be worthy of its name.


As recently as 1955 there were virtually no immigrants held in detention in the U.S. Today, the federal government holds tens of thousands each day, in 130 facilities across the country. But the story of how we got here did not start at the U.S.-Mexico border - it started on Florida's shores, 50 years ago.

Through personal histories and meticulously compiled archival materials, Detention By Design will tell how the arrival of Haitian and Cuban migrants by boat in the 1970s and 1980s - and the crude experiments in small Florida jails that followed - shaped the immigration and detention system that we have in this country today.


IN THE COMMUNITY

WLRN-TV Channel 17 is a PBS (Public Broadcasting Service) member station licensed to the School Board of Miami-Dade County, Florida. During an average month, Channel 17 reaches a monthly audience of approximately 232,555 TV households in the Miami-Ft. Lauderdale area with a viewing audience in four South Florida counties from Palm Beach to Key West.

WLRN is South Florida's PBS Ready-to-Learn station airing 45 hours of award-winning children's programming weekly. National distributors PBS, American Public Television, ACORN, and BBC provide the television primetime schedule featuring an eclectic array of programming to suit our diverse South Florida community. 
WLRN Presents Documentary: When Liberty Burns

This film provides an in-depth analysis of Miami's 1980 race riots in Liberty City. Remembered as the McDuffie riots, this two-hour film highlights the life and untimely death of Arthur Lee McDuffie at the hands of Miami Dade police officers. The documentary engages family members and friends of Arthur McDuffie, lead detectives, eyewitnesses, historians and contemporary community activists in interviews and it chronicles McDuffie's life and his rich relationships with his family and his community. When Liberty Burns also examines the context in which Miami developed during this country's Jim Crow era and traces the dynamics of race relations in the City while also managing increasingly diverse ethnic populations, growth and change. WLRN-TV premiered When Liberty Burns on Wednesday, February 2, 2022, at 9:00 pm for Black History Month programming.



WLRN Presents Documentary: The Life of Bill Baggs

Awarded with two Suncoast Regional Emmys, WLRN's original presentation of The Life of Bill Baggs traces writer Amy Paige Condon's 13-year journey to tell the story of one of the most influential newspaper editors of the mid-20th century. Bill Baggs, the late editor of the late Miami News, was a white editor of a prominent southern newspaper. He championed unpopular ideas in his front-page columns, such as protecting the environment, desegregating public schools, and peace in Vietnam. Under his leadership, the Miami News earned three Pulitzer Prizes. Despite his causes and accomplishments, when Baggs died of pneumonia in January 1969 at the age of forty-five, his story nearly died with him, and that would have been a travesty because Baggs still has so much to teach us about how to find the answers to those not-so-simple questions, like how to live in peace with one another. This story captures the history



of Miami, the community's geopolitical importance, and the loss of one of its greatest champions. The Life of Bill Baggs premiered on WLRN-TV, Wednesday, April 20th, at 9:30 pm.

Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Day Parade

On January 17, the WLRN production team live streamed and recorded the 46th Annual MLK Parade in Liberty City. Considered one of the oldest and largest celebrations in the U.S., thousands of paradegoers gathered to watch the three-hour event as it traversed along an 8 mile track that Dr. King once traveled during his frequent visits in Miami. WLRN-TV broadcasted a hosted one-hour highlight of the days event.

On April 9, 2022, WLRN held its inaugural EcoFest at the Mizner Park Amphitheater. The event was free to the community and had over 1,000 attendees, with more than fifty eco-friendly vendors and community non-profit organizations from 4Ocean, to Gumbo Limbo Nature Center, to Community Greening. The community event brought conservationists and families alike to celebrate Earth month by learning through engaging activities and exhibits as well as special guests like Zoo Miami's Ron Magill and presentations. The event included live music, a Junkanoo Band performance, free yoga class. and concluded with a premiere of original documentary WLRN's Troubled Waters: A Turtle's Tale.

Tallahassee Takeover

Tallahassee Takeover podcast series explores the ways Florida's GOP-controlled state government is stripping local control from cities, towns, and individuals, one law at a time. Surfside Condo Collapse

On June 24, 2021, a Surfside, Florida condo building collapsed in the early hours, killing 98 people. WLRN covered the immediate aftermath of the tragedy in the hours after the collapse, the search and recovery efforts, demolition of the remaining structure, creation of a memorial, and the searing pain felt by residents who lost loved ones and property.
