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1 THE COURT: This is the matter of the People
2 of the State of New York versus Jennifer Mullen.
3 Indictment 70805-25. Ms. Mullen appears today with
4 Attorney Fenchel. The People are represented by
5 Attorney Cooke.

6 We are on today just for further proceedings.
7 Ms. Mullen has entered a plea in anticipation of one
8 year of interim probation supervision. At that time we
9 didn't have the conditions for her to sign, so we do
10 have those now.

11 Attorney Fenchel, you've had an opportunity
12 to review those with Ms. Mullen?

13 MR. FENCHEL: I have and we are prepared to
14 execute the interim orders and conditions of probation
15 at the Court's direction.

16 THE COURT: Great. I'm going to give you two
17 more copies if you can just give them out.

18 MR. FENCHEL: A couple other matters for the
19 record.

20 THE COURT: Sure.

21 MR. FENCHEL: As I spoke with the prosecutor
22 prior to the conference, the prosecutor is not opposing
23 a certificate of relief from disability with regard to
24 Ms. Mullen's nursing license. We don't think that will
25 be an issue given the fact the guarantee or expectation

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1 in this case is that a little under a year from now
2 she'll return and she will receive a misdemeanor
3 conviction because she will no longer be convicted --

4 THE COURT: Right.

5 MR. FENCHEL: -- of the felony conviction,
6 but if there's any issue in between now and the
7 misdemeanor, actual conviction, we will approach the
8 Court for the certificate of relief from disabilities.

9 THE COURT: Okay.

10 MR. FENCHEL: I don't think that there are
11 any other issues.

12 THE COURT: Great.

13 MR. FENCHEL: Did I forget anything?

14 MS. COOKE: No.

15 MR. FENCHEL: Great. So we can execute
16 those. I know Your Honor doesn't have control over --
17 not important.

18 THE COURT: Okay.

19 MR. FENCHEL: So the record can reflect Ms.
20 Mullen is executing the interim orders of probation.
21 I'm providing them to the court officer as she signs
22 them. May I witness them, Your Honor, or does the
23 probation officer need to?

24 THE COURT: You can witness those. Thank
25 you.

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1 MR. FENCHEL: It's our intention to head down
2 to probation immediately after this proceeding to see
3 if they'll have her.

4 THE COURT: Thank you. My guess is they'll
5 tell her they are going to write her a letter, but I
6 think it's good to check in with them.

7 MR. FENCHEL: Also, Your Honor, just for the
8 record, as I had mentioned several months ago, there
9 wasn't a special condition listed on interim probation
10 supervision. There was some factual inaccuracies that
11 have been spread not for you, but to be clear, she paid
12 back the amount on her own accord well before the
13 conclusion of the case.

14 THE COURT: Right.

15 MR. FENCHEL: I'm happy to provide that to
16 the prosecutor. Maybe that's been confirmed and that's
17 why it's not on the interim terms of probation.

18 THE COURT: I imagine it is.

19 MS. COOKE: Yeah, this is mine for the file?

20 MR. FENCHEL: Yes. Yeah.

21 THE COURT: Great. Excellent. Okay,
22 anything else for the record today?

23 MS. COOKE: Sentencing date.

24 MR. FENCHEL: Nothing.

25 THE COURT: Sorry, I did put it on the

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1 conditions. It's June 29th, 2027. At what time?

2 COURT CLERK: Ten a.m.

3 THE COURT: Ten a.m.

4 MR. FENCHEL: Thank you, Your Honor.

5 THE COURT: All right. Ms. Mullen, thank
6 you, good luck. We will see you next year.

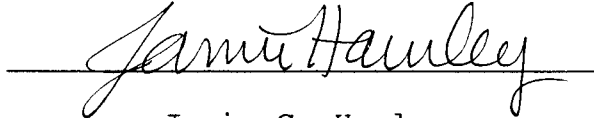
7 MR. FENCHEL: Thank you so much, Your Honor.
