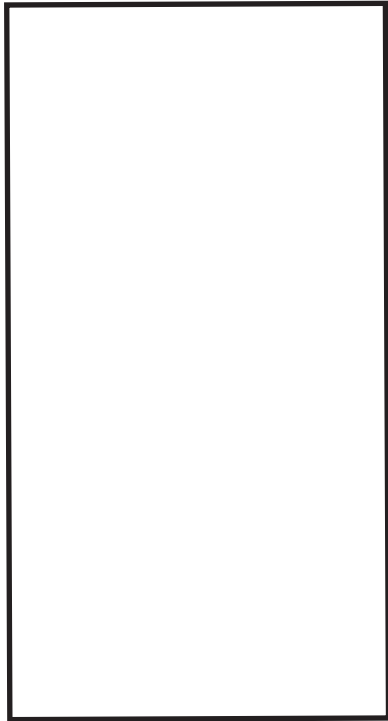

YOU SHOULD KNOW

This month You Should Know (YSK) features Dr. Anu Ogunleye, Assistant Professor of Agricultural Science at ENMU. Dr. Ogunleye teaches viewers the art of preparing Efo Riro, a traditional vegetable stew from southwestern Nigeria that is popular among the Yoruba people. In the Yoruba language, efo means leafy vegetables and riro means to stir or mix while cooking. The dish combines leafy greens such as spinach and peppers with assorted proteins, such as beef, fish, or shrimp, to create a rich and flavorful stew. Efo Riro is often served with pounded yam, fufu, eba, or rice and serves as a centerpiece for family meals and celebrations.

Becoming Elephant: The Orphans of Reteti

Set in the remote wilds of northern Kenya, follow the remarkable journey of orphaned elephants at Reteti, the first community-owned elephant sanctuary in Africa. Raised by Samburu keepers who act as surrogate parents, these elephants, many rescued from poaching, drought, or human-wildlife conflict, are nurtured back to health and prepared for life in the wild. From tiny calves taking their first bottle to older elephants facing release, the two-part series captures intimate moments of struggle, healing, and transformation.

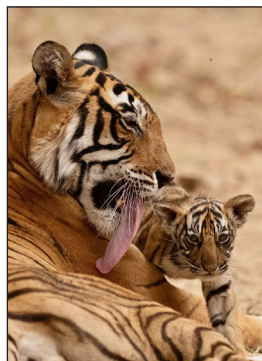

Legendary Tigers of India

Ranthambore National Park in northwestern India is known for its spectacular wildlife, specifically, its magnificent tigers. Centuries of hunting had driven the tigers into hiding, forcing them to live like ghosts. Then protected by Prime Minister Indira Gandhi's ban on hunting in the early 1970's, these tigers have grown from a group of a dozen cats into a clan of more than 70 members. Their territory is a set of lakes at the base of an ancient fort, rich with prey. For the last half-century, one man has followed, photographed and filmed them: the world's leading tiger expert, Valmik Thapar. His rich history opens the world's eye to the secret life of the tiger.

NOW HEAR THIS

Scott Yoo, violinist and conductor of the Mexico City Philharmonic, returns to host the seventh season of the critically acclaimed four-part miniseries. The new season explores the lives and works of Johannes Brahms and Scott Joplin, alongside the music scene of two major musical epicenters, Istanbul and Iceland. Johannes Brahms was a quiet, private person, but he lived a full life, bearing a responsibility he didn't want, loving a woman he couldn't be with, and carrying a legacy he couldn't live up to. Yoo discovers how Brahms reached a turning point in his life to become one of the greatest composers ever known. Scott Joplin was the king of ragtime, a new kind of music for the turn of the 20th century. Pianist John Novacek paints a picture of the birth of ragtime and the Joplin revival that finally brought him international fame.

THE LOST HERO

This documentary chronicles the life and legend of the Marquis de Lafayette—an intriguing, neglected, and controversial figure in both the American and French Revolutions, who at one time was the most famous man in the world. The film examines why a wealthy young French aristocrat would leave the comforts of the court to help a fledgling nation on another continent fight for independence. Lafayette's life and quest to bring democracy to America and France are shared, in part, as recorded in the extensive letters and memoirs of Lafayette, his wife Adrienne de Noailles, and his close friend, George Washington. The documentary uncovers the largely untold story of Lafayette's wife, Adrienne, and the arranged marriage that turned into a great romance and a partnership in revolution.

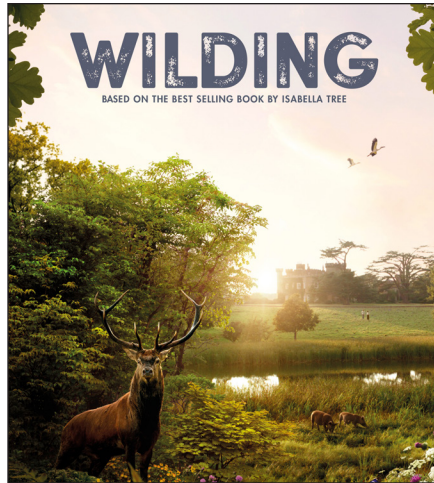
INTERNATIONAL JAZZ DAY FROM ABU DHABI
