WEAA's public affairs show For The Culture was recently recognized in Baltimore Magazine as Best DRIVE-TIME RADIO FARAJII MUHAMMAD If you're not a regular listener of WEAA, we urge you to check out Farajii Muhammad's evening drive-time show, "For the Culture," which brings a wide-ranging, lively, and well-informed discussion to the airwaves from a black Baltimore perspective. Kudos to Muhammad, who has experience in both youth development and broadcasting, for taking home a second place award from the Chesapeake Associated Press Broadcasters for Outstanding Public Affairs show. Also host Dr. Kaye Wise Whitehead of Today with Dr Kaye' was voted "Best Radio Host" in Baltimore by the Baltimore Sun, one of the "Top 100 Women" in Maryland by the Daily Record, and one of "25 Women to Watch" by the Baltimore Sun, she is one of the most sought-after keynote speakers in the country.

In Fiscal Year 2020, we served a community by having a number of shows that focused on racisms and inequality. The audience of WEAA last counted in the December Ratings book recorded that we served an audience made up of 96% African Americans. Our weekend programming extends across the diaspora. On Saturdays we talk topics concerning the listeners of Fiesta Musical, Caribbean Exchange and Afro World Beats. The host from the area were once residents of the areas and have leadership roles in the associations of the community. They make sure the community is connected with the news and information from a variety of cultures.

The grant provide by CPB allowed WEAA to pivot to remote programming during a year that was difficult to program with normal systems. It allowed us to upgrade systems to get signals from less than ideal locations and not stray from the in house produced programs our community expects. It allowed us to stay connected locally at times during unrest and to continuously give a community calm and a voice when they felt fear , frustration or isolation. We were able to stay as local as often as we possibly could to serve people who depended on the station for credible information for a community challenged by lives that were impacted by the pandemic. We made sure the information was credible and consistent with urgency.
