PROGRAM NOTES

We step into September with a sense of "Ahhh..."

The breezy weather is upon us, and we are oh so ready for pumpkin spice lattes and the backdrop of the colorful fall leaves! As we wind down from summer, WAMC helps you unwind with a Labor Day special on the red Scare, learn about the fashions of architecture on "Person Place Thing," and explore the existing technologies for atmospheric water harvesting.

SPECIAL PROGRAMMING

Monday, Sept. 2 (Labor Day) we'll hear a variety of specials including a Star Wars "Live From Tanglewood" tribute to start the day at 9 a.m. We'll continue with the untold story of the Red Scare's first true target – labor unions, at 11 a.m. And at 2 p.m. we'll hear back to back episodes of "A New York Minute in History." First the story of the La Amistad rebellion at 2 p.m. and then the establishment of Ronek Park, a non-discriminatory housing development built in 1950 at 2:30 p.m.

REGULAR PROGRAMMING

We head back to school on "The Academic Minute" with a week of segments from Florida International University to start off the month. Researchers from FIU will examine using flowers to clean up waterways, creating a calculus course where all students can succeed, and discuss how bilingualism can benefit premature babies. The other weeks of the month will

see interesting topics including whether A.I. will replace content creators, the science behind Ariana Grande's vocal metamorphosis, and closing gaps in OB/GYN training on plant-based nutrition. Tune in each weekday at 7:30 a.m. and at 3:56 p.m. on WAMC or anytime online at academicminute.org.

"Person Place Thing," brings us fresh, new shows beginning with "Ellis Island : The Dream of America" and composer Peter Boyer on Sept. 6; singer, songwriter, guitar player, teacher, author, innkeeper and founding member of the trio "The Roches" Terre Roche on Sept. 13; theatre director Ivo van Hove on Sept. 20; and architect Claire Weisz on Sept. 27. ["Person Place Thing"](#) airs Fridays at 10:30 p.m.

On "Earth Wise:" As the climate warms, city dwellers tend to suffer from extreme heat more than people in rural areas because of the urban heat island effect. Extensive surfaces of man-made materials like concrete, asphalt, and brick absorb the sun's energy and lead to temperatures well above those in the surrounding countryside. This month we'll explore how cities can take countermeasures that include creating urban green spaces full of plants to cool the surrounding air, and the use of cool roofs that reflect the sun's energy back into space. We'll also explore where states source their electricity from and hear updates about the Great Salt Lake. ["Earth Wise"](#) airs weekdays at 11:10 a.m. and 4:04 p.m.
