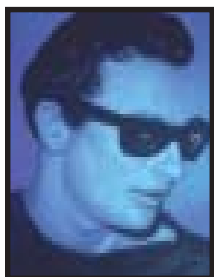

Buddy Holly: Rave On

With his black-framed glasses and tousled hair, Buddy Holly might have been the most unlikely looking rock 'n' roll star of the 50s. But the Lubbock, Texas native was, after Elvis Presley, unquestionably the most influential.

Buddy Holly: Rave On tells his story, from humble beginnings to his first record deal with Decca Records to the plane crash in February 1959 in Iowa that took his life, ending his prolific 18-month career. That day was immortalized in Don McLean's 1971 hit song "American Pie," and has become known as "the day the music died."



Featuring never-before-seen footage, the film presents exclusive interviews with those closest to Holly, along with clips of his performances and travels across the world. The documentary paints a picture of a man who changed the course of music. Rock 'n' roll started with Elvis, but pop music started with Buddy Holly and The Crickets. It is a story that deserves to be told again for a new generation.

Featuring songs such as "Peggy Sue," "Maybe Baby," "Well Allright" and "Not Fade Away," the program captures one of the most dramatic tales in music 60 years after Holly's game-changing, breakthrough hit "That'll Be the Day."

Buddy Holly: Rave On airs on 3-2 Monday, the 19th at 8:30 p.m. and Sunday, the 25th at 6:30 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Sunday, the 18th at 11:00 a.m., Thursday, the 22nd at 7:00 p.m. and Friday, the 23rd at 7:00 a.m.

Sinatra: In Concert at The Royal Festival Hall captures Ol' Blue Eyes masterful performance on stage in London. The performance took place on November 16th, 1970, just 26 days shy of his 55th birthday.

Before The Chairman took the stage, he was introduced to the audience by Princess Grace of Monaco. Kelly had

starred alongside Sinatra in the 1956 film *High Society*, the last film she made before her marriage to Rainier III, Prince of Monaco.

At Sinatra's invitation, Princess Grace had stepped in as a last-minute replacement for Noël Coward, who had taken ill. After a glowing introduction by Princess Grace, who described the Hoboken-born singer as "generous and warm-hearted," a beaming Sinatra stepped on stage and quipped, "What a press agent!"

Throughout the evening, Sinatra was in top form, serving up more than a dozen of his classics, such as "You Make Me Feel So Young," "Pennies From Heaven," "I've Got You Under My Skin," "Didn't We," "My Kind Of Town" and "My Way," as well as a superb rendition of George Harrison's love song "Something."

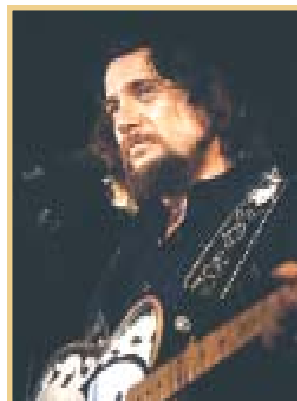

Hearing the Voices of Nagasaki Survivors

By the end of 1945, the atomic bombings of Japan had killed an estimated 140,000 people at Hiroshima and 74,000 at Nagasaki, including those who died from radiation poisoning. Often lost in those numbers are the experiences of the survivors, known as hibakusha (literally "atomic bomb-affected people").

Hearing the Voices of Nagasaki Survivors focuses on American writer Susan Southard's *Nagasaki: Life After Nuclear War*. The non-fiction book project developed from the author's encounter with "red back" Sumiteru Taniguchi, a hibakusha, who is famous from photographs of his severe burns caused by thermal radiation. Five hibakusha and their troubled lives in the aftermath of the Bomb are vividly depicted, in a history of Nagasaki that continues to move many Americans.

Hearing the Voices of Nagasaki Survivors follows the story to a college in the Midwest, where students are using the book as a text. In a region where it is widely believed that "dropping the Bomb was unavoidable," what lessons do young Americans discover in Southard's book?

Worlds of Ursula K. Le Guin

Although Holmes was by far the author's most famous creation, Doyle found himself trapped and overshadowed by the fictional detective.

Frustrated with not having enough time to work on other genres, Doyle tried creative measures to reduce his publisher's demand for more Holmes. He tried raising his asking price to such an absurd amount that they



would have to refuse him, but to his surprise they were willing to pay those large sums.

Eventually, Doyle killed off Holmes in the short story “The Final Problem” in 1893. This reprieve would be short-lived, as public outcry forced him to write another Holmes novel in 1901.




