Ol' Max Evans: The First Thousand Years

By the time I was 17, life was really whippin' up and the son of a gun never stopped. It has been a dead run for 90 damn years and my ears laid back all the time. — Max Evans

Ol' Max Evans: The First Thousand Years is a documentary portrait of the internationally renowned New Mexico author, best known for *The Rounders* and *The Hi Lo Country*, both of which were made into feature films. A true Renaissance man, Evans has also been a miner, prospector, movie producer, soldier in WWII (Max landed on Omaha Beach on D-Day), husband, father, accomplished artist working in the artists' colony of Taos, legendary hard-drinking, calf-roping cowboy, and finally,

a writer who chronicles the complex life of ranchers and cowboys in contemporary New Mexico. At 92, Evans is a gifted raconteur, one of a kind, and a vanishing breed of hero of the American West.

A KENW-TV production, **Ol' Max Evans** takes viewers on a fast-paced 90-minute ride through changing times, during which Max tells stories of Hollywood, studio executives, ranching, publishing houses, brawls with Hollywood friends such as director Sam Peckinpah, spiritual encounters with animals, and more. Acclaimed actors Sam Elliott and Peter Coyote lend their voices to the film; Coyote is the narrator and Elliott brings Max's prose to life.

Winner of the Western Writers of America's "Lifetime Achievement Award," Evans' career spans more than 60 years, over 25 books, and includes novels "Bluefeather Fellini" and "War and Music," short stories "For the Love of a Horse" and "Animal Stories, A Lifetime Collection," and nonfiction "Madame Millie."

SAMMY DAVIS, JR. : I've Gotta Be Me

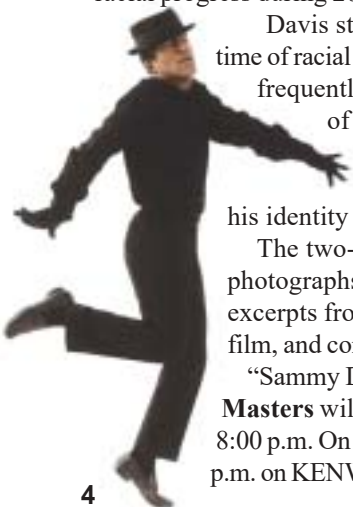
The legendary career of Sammy Davis, Jr. was so vast and multi-faceted that it was dizzying in its scope and scale. And yet, his life was complex, complicated, and contradictory.

"Sammy Davis, Jr.: I've Gotta Be Me" on **American Masters** is the first major film documentary to examine Davis' vast talent and his journey for identity through the shifting tides of civil rights and racial progress during 20th-century America.

Davis strove to achieve the American Dream in a time of racial prejudice and shifting political territory. He frequently found himself bracketed by the bigotry of white America and the distaste of black America. He was the most public black figure to embrace Judaism, thereby yoking his identity to another persecuted minority.

The two-hour program features never-before-seen photographs from Davis' vast personal collection and excerpts from his electric performances in television, film, and concert.

Redeeming Uncle Tom: The Josiah Henson Story

Redeeming Uncle Tom: The Josiah Henson Story tells the story of Josiah Henson (voiced by actor Danny Glover), the real-life inspiration for Uncle Tom in Harriet Beecher Stowe's classic 1852 novel, which has been recognized as one of the sparks that ignited the Civil War.

Josiah Henson was born into slavery near Port Tobacco, Maryland around 1789. As a child, he was sold to Isaac Riley, who later appointed him superintendent of the farm at an unusually young age

because of Henson's strength and intelligence. Riley entrusted Henson with exceptional responsibilities and permitted him to become a preacher in the Methodist Episcopal Church.

When Henson attempted to buy his freedom, however,

Riley cheated him and made plans to sell him south. Fearing separation from his family, he fled north with his wife and children in the summer of 1830. After escaping through Ohio and New York, they eventually settled in Ontario, Canada.

George Washington Carver: An Uncommon Life

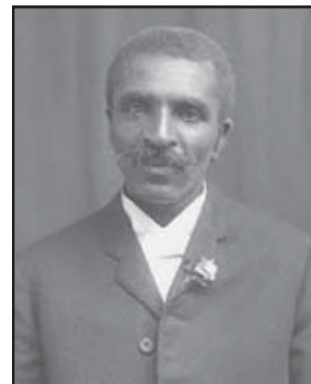

THE NERO FILES

The Roman emperor Nero is considered one of history's greatest criminals. His name has become synonymous with evil, as historic accounts have accused him of killing his stepbrother, his wife and his mother, as well as persecuting Christians and instigating the devastating Great Fire of Rome. This is the judgement that is passed in history from one generation to the next, but are these accounts of Nero's reign accurate?

New scientific discoveries and a closer examination of the ancient texts written about Nero cast a different light on the Roman emperor and the accusations levelled against him.

It is believed that Nero turned to matricide because of an ongoing power struggle with his mother. He engineered a plan to have her swept off a boat and drowned at sea.

The phrase 'fiddling while Rome burned,' refers to the belief that Nero played music while watching the destruction of his city. He also been accused of starting the terrible blaze in order to make room for his own construction projects and then, after blaming Christians for the fire, had them brutally and publicly executed.

SEALAB

“Sealab” on **American Experience** tells the mostly forgotten story of the U.S. Navy’s daring program that tested the limits of human endurance, revolutionized the way humans explored the ocean, and laid the groundwork for undersea military missions to come.

An audacious feat of engineering—a pressurized underwater habitat, complete with science labs and living quarters—Sealab aimed to prove that humans were capable of spending days or even months at a stretch living and working on the ocean floor.

Divers who attempted to chart the ocean’s depths faced barriers that had thwarted humans for centuries: near total blackness, bone-jarring cold, and intense pressure that could disorient the mind and crush the body.

In the spring of 1964, Scott Carpenter—already famous for being the second American to orbit the earth—was preparing for a new mission, not into space as an astronaut but into the sea as one of the Navy’s newly-minted “aquanauts.”

That same year, Sealab, manned by five aquanauts including Carpenter, was lowered to the ocean floor off Bermuda. After ten days, the men emerged safe and sound. They would next test Sealab in a far more inhospitable domain—one that would push the men to the very edge of human endurance.

Sealab II consisted of three teams of aquanauts each taking turns living on the ocean floor for 15 days. When Sealab II finally resurfaced on October 11th, 1965, it had been continuously staffed for 45 days, including Scott Carpenter’s record stay of 30 days.

The aquanauts daring exploits were beginning to capture the nation’s attention, but when Sealab III was lowered into the ocean, a deadly tragedy would prematurely end their pioneering work.

Greely and his men completed that task, only to be abandoned in one of the harshest environments on Earth. "The Greely Expedition" reveals how poor planning, personality clashes, questionable decisions, and pure bad luck conspired to turn a noble scientific mission into a human tragedy.

Saving Brinton: America Reframed

In the late 19th and early 20th centuries, The Brinton Entertainment Co. of Washington, Iowa, would travel throughout the Midwest bringing films, magic lantern slides, and other forms of entertainment to populations who, in many cases, had never before seen such sights.

Brinton's stash of movies included priceless relics, such as rare footage of President Teddy Roosevelt, the first moving images from Burma, a lost relic from magical effects godfather Georges Mélié, and the Galveston hurricane of 1900 (widely regarded as the world's first newsreel).

Travel with Rick Steves on FM

Guidebook author and travel host Rick Steves is America's most respected authority on European travel. Rick took his first trip to Europe in 1969, visiting piano factories with his father, a piano importer. As an 18-year-old, Rick began traveling on his own, funding his trips by teaching piano lessons.

In 1976, he started his business, **Rick Steves' Europe**, which has grown from a one-man operation to a company with a staff of 100 full-time employees at his Washington state headquarters. There he produces more than 50 guidebooks on European travel, America's most popular travel series on PBS, a weekly hour-long national public radio show, and much more.
