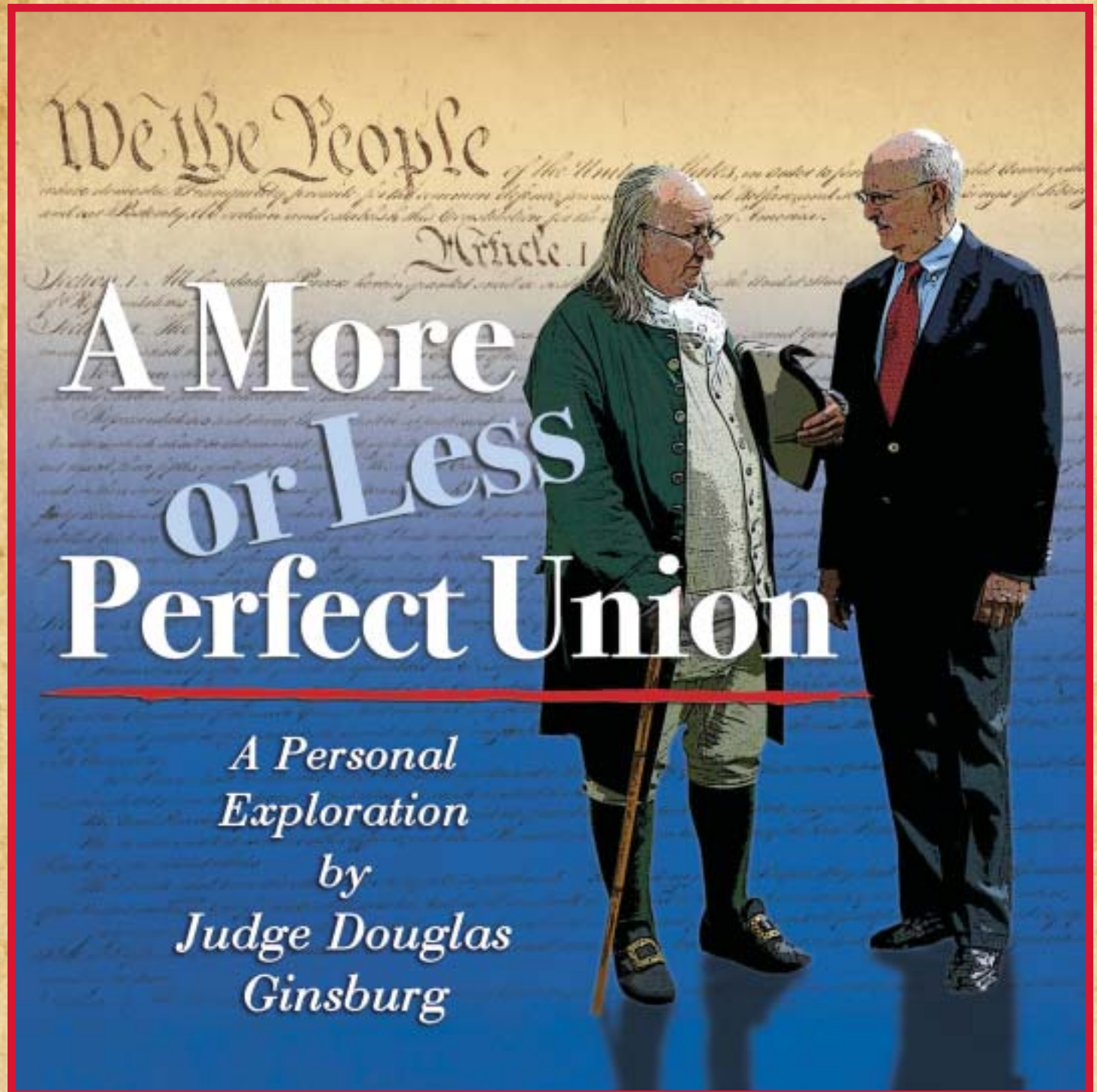

4. **Nova** premieres “**Polar Extremes**,” a two-hour special that takes viewers on a surprising adventure from pole to pole and back in time to uncover the extraordinary story of the Earth’s poles and their changing climates.

A More or Less Perfect Union is a three-part series that explores the U.S. Constitution, and features perspectives from constitutional experts of all stripes— liberal, conservative and libertarian—examining the key issues of liberty.

5. “**Poison Squad**” on **American Experience** tells the story of chemist Dr. Harvey Wiley, who, in the late 1800s, used human subjects in a scientific study to raise alarm about the toxic substances lurking in the nation’s food products.

In honor of Black History Month, **American Masters** presents “**Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool**,” that explores the life and work of a beloved musical giant—the man behind the horn.

A Very British Romance with Lucy Worsley, a two-part special, explores three centuries of love’s rituals and how they have been affected by social, political and cultural ideas.

6. With 30 million more men than women in China, **Independent Lens** follows three of China’s educated and professional women who are labeled “**Leftover Women**,” a derogatory term that is part of a state-sponsored campaign to stigmatize women in their 20s and 30s who are not married.

Then, **Independent Lens** presents “**We Believe in Dinosaurs**,” the story of a \$120 million Noah’s Ark at the Creation Museum in Kentucky, an exhibit designed to prove the Bible is scientifically and historically accurate.

Guru Nanak: The Founder of Sikhism – Life & Legacy sheds light on the incredible life of the 15th-century teacher, poet and activist whose spiritual legacy continues to influence Sikhism’s approximately 30 million followers.

In **Christina Cooks: Back to the Cutting Board**, Christina Pirello shares healthy, fresh Italian and Mediterranean plant-based recipes using accessible ingredients and simple techniques designed to optimize food’s natural flavors.

During the Prohibition era, Bill McCoy earned the name **The Real McCoy** because he always delivered uncut, undiluted gin, rum and whiskey to his patrons, an activity that transformed him from modest boat builder to public enemy number one.

POLAR EXTREMES

Of all the fresh water that exists on Earth today, 70% of it is frozen, held in glaciers and ice caps, most of it in the Arctic and Antarctic. Today, the Arctic is warming faster than anywhere else in the world, and Antarctica has locked in its ice enough water to raise sea level by a terrifying 200 feet. The way that the poles respond to a warming climate is one of the greatest wildcards in predicting our climate future.

“Polar Extremes” is a one-night, two-hour **Nova** hosted by renowned paleontologist Kirk Johnson. The film takes viewers on a dramatic and surprising adventure from pole to pole and back in time—650 million years ago to present day—to uncover the extraordinary story of the Earth’s poles and their changing climates.

Hidden in the rocks and trapped under the ice are clues that reveal a planet totally different from the one we know today. Following a trail of strange fossils found in all the wrong places—beech trees in Antarctica, alligators in the Arctic—Johnson finds evidence that the Arctic was once covered in a subtropical forest and dinosaurs once lived near the South Pole. A journey to the hot Death Valley desert uncovers rocks that could only get there by glacier, revealing another very different age, when ice sheets extended from pole to pole, turning the entire globe into a giant “snowball” Earth.

Can the stories of the past reveal what will happen to the poles—and the rest of our planet—in the future? To search for answers, Johnson travels to remote places, featuring polar expeditions, white water rafting, helicopters, goldmines, rappelling into glaciers, fossil digs and more.

Long before humans arrived on the scene, greenhouse gasses that warmed the planet came from natural sources. Today, much of

the carbon emitted to the atmosphere comes from the burning of fossil fuels. Johnson demonstrates just how much carbon we’re adding to the air with the help of a 1965 Rambler.



There are potential parallels to our present—and future—climate story. Johnson uncovers one possible parallel in a quarry in Virginia, where a backhoe unearths a treasure trove of fossils: clams and scallops that populated a shoreline three million years ago. The shells are dramatically out of place, since the quarry is now located 90 miles inland. At the time these creatures were alive, there was no ice in the Arctic, causing sea levels to be substantially higher, and pushing the coastline inland. During that period, carbon dioxide levels—one of the main factors determining global temperature—were about the same as they are today.

On a trip to the Canadian Rockies, Johnson goes deep into a cave inside the permafrost, a thick subsurface layer of soil that remains frozen throughout the year, occurring mainly in polar regions. Today’s permafrost holds about twice as much carbon as is in our atmosphere. If the permafrost thaws across all the frozen land at the poles, a massive release of methane and CO₂ will speed up Earth’s global warming—creating an unprecedented threat to humanity.

Nova shows that the Earth’s distant past is directly relevant to our collective future. “Humans are geology, and we are impacting this planet,” says Johnson. “This is the first time that a mammal has actually changed the composition of the Earth’s atmosphere and driven a dramatic change in the Earth’s climate. The question is, are we clever enough and forward-thinking enough to flip that switch back?”

A More or Less Perfect Union



A More or Less Perfect Union explores the U.S. Constitution—the document that governs those who govern us—delving into past, present and future struggles for liberty.

The three-part series is hosted by Judge Douglas H. Ginsburg, a constitutional expert, with 30 years of experience on the Federal Court of Appeals in Washington, DC. The series features perspectives and interviews

from constitutional experts of all stripes—liberal, conservative and libertarian—examining the key issues of liberty: freedom of religion and press, slavery and civil rights, the Second Amendment, separation of powers and more.

“A Constitution in Writing” examines the struggles and compromises in the creation of the document that defines the United States of America. From the battlefield at Old Sturbridge Village, Massachusetts, to Independence Hall and Boston Harbor, Judge Ginsburg ponders: Were the powerful words used by the Framers meant to be updated by courts as our nation evolves, or only by following the amendment process specified in the Constitution itself? Constitutional experts and the Framers themselves weigh in on the document, the rule of law, and the three branches of government separated to prevent tyranny.

“A Constitution for All” explores Constitutional amendments, including the Bill of Rights and amendments related to equal pro-

tection, slavery, and voting rights through significant Supreme Court decisions that include Dred Scott v. Sandford and several cases affecting LGBTQ rights, with interviews at locations ranging from the Whitney Plantation in Louisiana to the Newseum in Washington, DC. Hot-button historical issues are addressed, including limits on rights of free speech, free press, bearing arms and individual protections such as due process during arrest and trial, unenumerated rights and unalienable rights.

For more than two centuries, Americans have fought to establish liberty, expand liberty and preserve liberty. **A More or Less Perfect Union** concludes with episode three, “Our Constitution at Risk,” which shows how the Constitution is under pressure today and how, through action or inaction, all three branches of government are contributing to the problem.

Judge Ginsburg asks: Are we ceding our rights so gradually that we don’t even know it is happening? He concludes, “The great safeguard of liberty is a government of laws and not of men. Our Constitution creates that government, but it works only if ‘we the people’ know the Constitution and protect it.”

POISON SQUAD

At the close of the 19th century, more and more Americans migrated to cities and away from farm life and fresh, homegrown food. Completely unregulated, the burgeoning food manufacturing industry took off as millions of Americans needed access to readily available and affordable food. In this pre-refrigeration world, meatpacking and canning companies sought ways to keep their products fresh at the lowest possible cost, regularly processing products with untested chemical preservatives.

Milk was diluted with water and then sometimes whitened with plaster of paris or chalk to get rid of its bluish tint; formaldehyde was often added to sweeten the taste of souring milk, while pureed calf brains could be used to mimic the cream on top. In big cities, tainted milk was a breeding ground for deadly bacteria, outbreaks of scarlet fever, tuberculosis and cholera were common. Since no ingredient labeling was required, other dairy products like oleomargarine made from scraps from meatpackers were sold as butter and corn syrup was marketed as honey and maple syrup.

Dr. Harvey Wiley, a chemist working at the U.S. Department of Agriculture, had been trying for years to raise the alarm about the perils lurking on market shelves. Determined to banish dangerous substances from American dinner tables, Wiley faced enormous opposition from big business and their lobbyists and cronies in Congress. He decided that the only way to prove the toxicity of these chemicals would be through a scientific study using human subjects.

In 1902, Wiley recruited 12 robust young men with brave hearts and strong stomachs and fed them meals tainted with increasing doses of common chemical additives such as borax, salicylic acid, sodium benzoate and formaldehyde. In exchange for free food and five dollars a month, these volunteers, dubbed the “Poison Squad,” agreed to eat only the meals served by Dr. Wiley, submit to a battery of physical examinations after each meal, and promise not to sue the federal government if they were injured or sickened in the process.

Soon newspaper reporters were covering the colorful and often stomach-churning exploits of Wiley’s “Poison Squad” and the public was transfixed. Wiley’s experiments became one of the most influential scientific studies of the 19th century. Finally, in 1906, decades after he first sounded the alarm, Congress passed the Meat Inspection Act and the Pure Food and Drug Act—the first consumer protection laws in the nation’s history.

Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool

In honor of Black History Month, **American Masters** presents “Miles Davis: Birth of the Cool,” a deep dive into the world of a beloved musical giant. Stanley Nelson’s Grammy nominated film tells the story of a truly singular talent and unpacks the man behind the horn.

The film takes a hard look at the mythology that surrounds the legend. “The story of Miles Davis—who he was as a man and artist—has often been told as the tale of a drug-addled genius,” said Nelson. “You rarely see a portrait of a man that worked hard at honing his craft, a man who deeply studied all forms of music, from Baroque to classical Indian. An elegant man who could render ballads with such tenderness yet hold rage in his heart from the racism he faced throughout his life. He could be romantic and pursue women relentlessly, yet treat them with cruelty upon winning them over. He could be extremely generous, yet rescind that generosity on a whim.”

The documentary delves into the six-decade career of the musical genius: from his days as a Juilliard student to the development of his signature sound on recordings with his famous quintet, to his shifts to new musical paradigms in the 70s and 80s. As the film tracks Davis’s boundary-breaking musical triumphs, the meanderings of his complicated personal life are told with intimate reflections from those closest to him. A soundtrack full of Davis’s music is complemented by new interviews with friends, fellow musicians, collaborators and scholars to create a full portrait of the complex man.

A Very British Romance with Lucy Worsley

Worsley’s exploration of three centuries of love’s rituals begins in the Georgian age. She explores the glamorization of romantic love that followed the emergence of the romantic novel in the 18th century by examining the works of Samuel Richardson, Fanny Burney and Jane Austen.

Worsley discovers how medieval chivalry shaped Victorian courtship, and explores the influence of valentine’s cards and flowers on romantic lives. And she uncovers the way that literary passions—in novels by writers such as Charlotte Bronte, Mrs. Henry Wood and H.G. Wells—translated into real-life desires, changing the way the British felt.

As single women search for “Mr. Right,” they struggle to stay true to their personal and professional ambitions amid pressure from their families, friends and a government that launched a state-sponsored campaign to stigmatize unwed women.

One of the women, lawyer Qiu Hua Mei, was the first in her village to get an education, yet her family sees her as a failure, and her pursuit of a partner seems futile after a crushing interview with a dating counselor who suggests she lower her standards.

As the citizens of Williamstown wait for the economic boon promised by the Ark’s founders, creationists spread the gospel of a 6,000 year-old Earth.

The Real McCoy recounts the extraordinary life and legendary exploits of this man who personified the tumultuous times in which he lived. The film charts McCoy’s transformation from modest boat builder to public enemy number one.

Guru Nanak The Founder of Sikhism Life & Legacy

Guru Nanak, the founder of Sikhism, was a 15th-century teacher, poet and activist whose message of justice and equality for all, women’s empowerment, service to others and devotion to nature and the environment was ahead of his time. Virtually unknown to much of the Western world, the documentary **Guru Nanak: The Founder of Sikhism – Life and Legacy** now sheds light on his incredible life. This year will mark the 550th birthday of Guru Nanak Dev Ji.

Born in 1469 in the Punjab region of India and Pakistan, Nanak traveled extensively to spread his belief that we can find the divinity within each of us through prayer, humility, service, meditation and virtuous living. He was a mystic and a philosopher who denounced discrimination against women and those of lower socioeconomic status. Nanak’s followers became known as Sikhs, which means seekers of truth.

Filed on location in India, Pakistan and throughout the U.S., the film not only follows the life of Guru Nanak, but explores how his spiritual legacy continues to influence Sikhism’s approximately 30 million followers—including prominent American Sikh men and women such as Mayor Ravi Bhalla of Hoboken, N.J., and Grammy Award nominee Snamat Kaur, who, along with others, share their experiences in the film.

The film includes narration by Bishop Chane, a Christian leader and former head of the Washington National Cathedral; Rabbi David Rosen, a Jewish authority and well respected interfaith leader; and Bob Thurman, a Buddhist scholar and one of *Time* magazine’s 50 most influential people.

The Groveland Four

The Groveland Four explores a 1949 rape case that led to a race riot, multiple murders, two trials, a Supreme Court reversal, and the assassination of a Florida civil rights leader.

At the time, Lake County, Florida, was considered the citrus capital of the world and laborers were needed to work in the fields. Lake County was under the strict jurisdiction of Sheriff Willis McCall, whose brutal treatment of blacks had become widely known.

When a white farm wife alleged she was assaulted by four black men on the rural roads of Lake County, Sheriff McCall identified four suspects: Samuel Shepherd, Walter Irvin, Earnest Thomas and Charles Greenlee. The film chronicles the injustices faced by these defendants at the hands of the Jim Crow-era U.S. criminal justice and court systems.

In January 2019, the state of Florida apologized for the events that happened in 1949, and the state's clemency board voted to posthumously pardon the four men involved.

Prince Among Slaves

Prince Among Slaves is the true story of Prince Abdul-Rahman, a man of power and privilege in South Africa, who was captured in war when he was 26 years old, sold to slave traders, and shipped to America.

Slave though he was, Ibrahima was an educated, aristocratic man, and he was made overseer of the large cotton and tobacco plantation of his master, who refused to sell him for any price.

Ibrahima's forty year battle for freedom attracted the support of men such as President John Quincy Adams and U.S. Secretary of State Henry Clay, whose intercession finally gained Ibrahima's freedom in 1828. Sixty-six years old, Ibrahima sailed for Africa the following year with his wife.

Prince Among Slaves is the story of a remarkable man who endured the humiliation of slavery without ever losing his dignity or his hope for freedom.

But his fate took a different turn, and Lewis rose from Alabama's Black Belt to the corridors of power on Capitol Hill, his humble origins forever linking him to those whose voices customarily go unheard. Now, 76, he is considered the conscience of Congress. In 2019, Lewis was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer.

At the height of his career, Paul Williams wasn't always welcome in the restaurants and hotels he designed or the neighborhoods where he built homes. Williams used talent, determination and even charm to defy the odds and create a body of work that can be found from coast to coast.
