## THE VOTE

**It's a story about power—"who has it and who doesn't want to give it up," says constitutional lawyer and writer Michael Waldman. "We're still fighting over who has that power."**

One hundred years after the passage of the 19th Amendment, **American Experience** "The Vote," a two-part, four-hour documentary, tells the dramatic story of the epic—and surprisingly unfamiliar—hard-fought crusade waged by American women for the right to vote. The film focuses on how the challenges facing the women's suffrage movement, including internal debates over radical tactics and the place of African American women in the movement, shaped the battle in the crucial period from 1906-1915.

That right to vote was fought for and *won* by three generations of American women who, over the course of more than seven decades, carried out one of the most sustained and successful political movements in all of American history. "The Vote" brings to life the unsung leaders of the movement and the deep controversies over gender roles and race that divided Americans then—and continue to dominate political culture today.

From the moment the clamor for woman suffrage first was raised in the United States in the 1840s, the question was *how* the vote would ever be won. Resistance to women's participation in the political sphere came from every quarter of American society—from political machines eager to maintain their power, industrial interests fearful for their profits, even many women, who were convinced that wielding the ballot would somehow diminish their influence in society. Compounding the opposition, from the late 19th century on, was the poisonous legacy of Reconstruction and the determination of the former Confederate states to preserve white supremacy, in large part by barring African Americans from the polls.



**Suffragists were the first Americans to picket in front of the White House and the first to employ the techniques of non-violent civil disobedience. They were jailed, went on hunger strikes and were force-fed by authorities. In February of 1917, their message was "MR. PRESIDENT, HOW LONG MUST WOMEN WAIT FOR LIBERTY."**

As of 1909, despite six decades of relentless struggle, suffragists could point to little in the way of progress. Just four states had extended the franchise to women. The federal woman suffrage amendment—introduced in the Senate in 1878—had virtually no support on Capitol Hill, and most in the first generation of activists had gone to their graves without casting a ballot.

Stung by a string of bitter state-level defeats in the fall of 1915, the suffragists decided to concentrate their energies on the passage of a federal amendment. One faction, under the leadership of the National American Woman Suffrage Association's President Carrie Chapman Catt, was determined to pursue a moderate course and work within the political system, while another, Alice Paul's National Woman's Party, deployed ever-more confrontational and controversial methods of protest. The two efforts pushed the movement to its crescendo in tandem, and forever transformed the politics of social change in America.

## Unladylike2020

**American Masters** "Unladylike2020" illuminates the inspiring stories of 26 courageous, little-known and diverse female trailblazers from the turn of the 20th century.

These American heroines achieved many firsts, including earning an international pilot's license, becoming a bank president, founding a hospital, fighting for the desegregation of public spaces, exploring the Arctic and singing opera at Carnegie Hall.

Only a century ago, women in America had only recently won the right to own property or get divorced. It was illegal for married women to work in some places and women could even be arrested for wearing pants in public. Women who worked outside of the home were usually single, widowed, divorced, poor or women of color who had to contend not only with sexism, but also severe racial discrimination.

Despite these obstacles, intrepid women managed to break into new professions, step into leadership roles and fight for suffrage and an end to discrimination—challenging expected behavior for "a lady."

## By One Vote: Woman Suffrage in the South

By the summer of 1920, 35 states had ratified the 19 Amendment, bringing it one vote short of the required 36. The Tennessee state legislature had convened a special session to consider ratification, and the measure easily passed the state's Senate but stalled in the House of Representatives.

In August 1920 after weeks of intense debate, a 48-48 tie in the Tennessee legislature defeated a motion to table the amendment. The measure was then called to a ratification vote, and it seemed certain that the final roll call would maintain the deadlock.

Tennessee legislator Harry T. Burn, a 24-year-old freshman legislator from Niota, Tennessee, a town of about 400 people, was personally opposed to women's suffrage. On the day of the vote, Burn donned a red rose in his lapel that signaled his opposition to the amendment and his intention to vote "nay."

But on the morning of the vote, Burn received a note from his mother, imploring her son to "be a good boy" and vote for ratification. Facing one of the most important crossroads in American history, with the fundamental rights of half the nation hanging in the balance, Burn listened to his mother and said "aye." With that single syllable he extended the vote to the women of America and ended half a century of tireless campaigning by generations of suffragists.

## CLINTON

“Clinton” explores the fascinating story of an American president who rose from a turbulent childhood in Arkansas to become one of the most successful politicians in modern American history. From Monica Lewinsky to a balanced budget, the presidency of William Jefferson Clinton veered between sordid scandal and grand achievement. “Clinton” is an encore presentation in the acclaimed collection of presidential biographies on **American Experience**.

The two-part, four-hour film follows Clinton across his two terms as he confronted some of the key forces that would shape the future, including partisan political warfare and domestic and international terrorism. Most memorably, it explores how Clinton’s conflicted character made history, even as it enraged his enemies and confounded his friends.

Part 1 “The Comeback Kid” – Overcoming a troubled upbringing marred by alcoholism and violence, Clinton is determined from the start to succeed, first in Arkansas, then at Georgetown, Oxford and finally Yale. There he meets a young woman named Hillary Rodham who shares his intellect and idealism. Together they forge a marriage and political partnership that takes them to the Arkansas governor’s mansion and ultimately the White House, an election Clinton wins despite a campaign repeatedly under siege by allegations ranging from draft dodging to womanizing.

Despite all of their education and experience, the Clintons are unprepared for politics in Washington, which quickly descends into open warfare with the Republican establishment and much of the media. The arrival of a new and formidable rival named Newt Gingrich threatens to derail the Clinton presidency before it ever gets off the

ground. When Republicans gain control of Congress in the midterm elections, the entire political landscape shifts to the right, leaving Clinton seemingly bereft of power.

Part 2: “The Survivor” – Shattered by the 1994 Republican victory, Clinton begins to sideline his most trusted advisors in favor of an aggressive political consultant named Dick Morris, who uses extensive polling to diagnose the administration’s weaknesses and develop strategies to correct them.

The Republican “Contract with America” is riding high and by spring of 1995, Gingrich and his allies select the ground on which to wage their war: a plan to eliminate the federal budget deficit by drastically cutting Medicare and Medicaid. The plan leads to a government shutdown and slowly the tide begins to turn toward the president, who reclaims the political center with a stream of new initiatives that will curb big government and appeal to middle class families. Clinton wins the 1996 election in a landslide, pulling off one of the greatest turnarounds in political history. But events have been set in motion that will soon divide the country and nearly destroy Clinton’s presidency.

**Eastland: The Shipwreck that Shook America** is the untold story of the worst disaster on the Great Lakes in U.S. history. More than 2,500 immigrant Chicago factory workers boarded the SS Eastland



in the summer of 1915, heading to a company picnic, but the heavily loaded steamship had a dark secret that the passengers never knew.

Horrified Chicago commuters watched as the Eastland flipped over while tied to its dock, within feet of one the busiest intersections in

Chicago's famed Loop District. In a matter of minutes, the tragedy killed 844, mostly women and children, including 21 entire families.

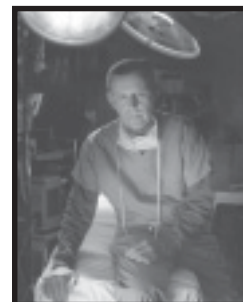
Court documents revealed that the Eastland's wealthy owners knew of the ship's stability problems months before the disaster. The effort to bring them to justice, however, was thwarted by the then down-on-his-luck lawyer Clarence Darrow. Darrow defended engineer Joseph Erickson—one of the heroes of the ship—whose bosses blamed for the disaster. Darrow's shocking defense of Erickson was never mentioned in the lawyer's later memoirs.

**Eastland** is a compelling story of heroes, villains, corruption, greed, courtroom drama and in the end, the miscarriage of justice.

## Burden of Genius: Dr. Thomas Starzl's Journey into Organ Transplantation

In 1967, Dr. Thomas Starzl stunned the world with the first successful liver transplantation. Critics accused him of recklessness, even murder. Others declared it the beginning of a revolution. In his lifetime, the man who is called "the father of transplantation" overcame seemingly insurmountable obstacles to make the reality of organ transplantation a "routine miracle."



**Burden of Genius** plunges the viewer into the controversy swirling around Starzl's turbulent 60-year career before we land in the 1980s, the decade when organ transplantation, the stuff of science fiction, becomes a reality. Accusations of blind career ambition collide with reflections from colleagues and patients who credit him with saving thousands of lives through his innovations in surgery and immunotherapy.

Throughout, Starzl pushes himself relentlessly, acquiring mythic status and attracting the most talented young surgeons in the world, who now run most of its top transplant centers.

**Burden of Genius** is the story of an innovator as complex and elusive as the biological secrets he unlocked. It is also a reflection on the price of scientific progress by the man many consider the greatest surgeon of the 20th century.

Unfortunately, **Burden of Genius: Dr. Thomas Starzl's Journey into Organ Transplantation** was withdrawn after our July program guide had gone to press. Hopefully, the program will be released sometime in the future.

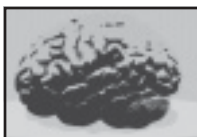

gioma—a benign, treatable brain tumor. Dr. Kim reveals how brain tumors form and develop, and discusses surgical advances that make removing them safer for patients today.

The play "Brain Interrupted" walks audiences through the neuroscience of adolescent epilepsy and discusses brain-mapping technology that eases the suffering of those who live with seizures.

Finally, the "Double Windsor" knot is elegant and difficult to tie under the best of circumstances—and seemingly impossible if you've suffered a stroke and lost the use of your left hand. This story demonstrates how new therapies and emerging technologies are making second chances possible for people who have experienced stroke and other traumatic brain injuries.

To help execute this mission, Vertical Harvest employs adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, who receive a competitive wage and have the opportunity to work in their community year round.

The documentary weaves together the story of the farm's first tumultuous 15 months of operation with the personal journeys of several employees.

It is also a remarkable filmmaking achievement, capturing not only the struggle of Geoff and Simon's journey but the beauty of the environment they are battling.


