Prince Albert: A Victorian Hero Revealed

History remembers Prince Albert as Queen Victoria's German husband whose untimely death inspired decades of mourning. New material also suggests he played a profound role as a reformer whose innovative ideas transformed Great Britain's fortunes.

In **Prince Albert: A Victorian Hero Revealed**, Professor Saul David looks through Windsor Castle's archives to tell the German prince's story. With access to more than 20,000 of Albert's private letters, journals and photographs, David examines his lasting influence on British culture and governmental policy. Historians consider Albert one of the greatest Englishmen ever, though he was German.



Among the items in the archives is the copy of Sir Walter Scott's *Peveril of the Peak*, which Victoria read aloud to Albert, with a black marker showing where she stopped reading when he died at age 42.

Secrets of the Royal Jewels

The sparkling documentary **Secrets of the Royal Jewels** takes a close look at the tiaras, earrings, rings and necklaces that make up the royal collection, and tells the incredible stories behind them as they pass through the generations.

The most spectacular of all is the Koh-i-Noor diamond, translated as "the mountain of light." It sits right in the center of the British Imperial State Crown created in 1937 for King George VI. Probably the most famous diamond in the world, it's more than 300 years old and comes from India. It has never been sold, only taken away by force from one owner to another.

In 1849, after the colonization of India, the diamond landed in Queen Victoria's hands. After independence, the Indian government asked the English to return their national treasure, but the British government refused.

Secrets of the Royal Jewels can be seen on 3-2 Tuesday, the 30th at 7:00 p.m. Watch for additional plays on 3-2 and 3-1 in July.

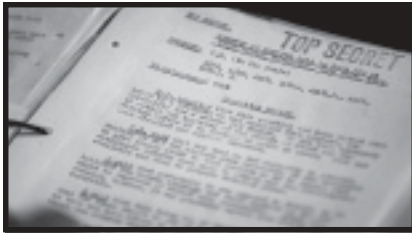
Lucy Worsley's Royal Myths & Secrets

The three-part series investigates how royal history is a mixture of facts, exaggeration, manipulation and mythology. Viewers learn the true stories behind Elizabeth I and her victory over the Spanish Armada, Queen Anne and the gossip that destroyed her image and legacy, and the secrets and myths that doomed Marie Antoinette, blamed for causing the French Revolution by saying "let them eat cake" to her starving subjects.

Operation Foxley – Mission: Liquidate Hitler

Operation Foxley – Mission: Liquidate Hitler recounts the full story and the detailed plan that could have led to the assassination of Adolf Hitler, and ultimately reveals why it failed.

On June 6, 1944, more than 150,000 allied troops stormed the beaches of Normandy and their victory against the Nazis was one of the major turning points in the war. Germany would eventually surrender nearly a year later, but the European theater, and possibly World War II itself, could have ended just one month after D-Day.

Operation Foxley was a scheme devised by the British government to assassinate Adolf Hitler during one of his solitary morning walks outside of his residence at the Berghof in the Bavarian mountains. It was the best chance anyone had of killing Hitler, but numerous roadblocks stopped the plan from succeeding—including the British government itself.

Operation Foxley is based on the British secret service's declassified documents and features fictionalized reenactments of the events.

Operation Foxley–Mission: Liquidate Hitler airs on 3-2 Tuesday, the 9th at 8:00 p.m. and Sunday, the 14th at 5:00 p.m. On 3-1, watch it Monday, the 15th at 7:00 p.m. and Tuesday, the 16th at 7:00 a.m.



Divided We Fall: Unity Without Tragedy

Divided We Fall: Unity Without Tragedy brings ordinary citizens together to wrestle with the complex issues that divide our nation. Breaking out of partisan echo chambers to listen to one another, the participants explore what it means to be an American, what constitutes a “more perfect union” and what can be done to bridge the gaps between them.

Over the course of two days, two sets of twelve individuals—equal numbers of whom strongly approve and disapprove of President Donald Trump and equal numbers of men and women, from Gen Xers to millennials—faced a series of topics and exercises about the challenges facing our country. They discussed the legacy of September 11, race, gun control, immigration, the news media and more.

The honest, open conversations revealed that despite divisions that are exploited and amplified on social media and cable news by pundits and politicians, that ordinary Americans “choose unity.” They want the core of our democratic experiment—“We the People” to succeed.

Divided We Fall: Unity Without Tragedy will be broadcast on 3-2 Tuesday, the 9th at 10:00 p.m. and Thursday, the 11th at 7:00 p.m. On 3-1, it airs Friday, the 12th at 9:00 p.m. and Tuesday, the 23rd at 7:00 p.m.



Over a nearly 50-year period, one of the largest cities in America was run by socialists. Between 1910 and 1960, the people of Milwaukee, WI elected three socialist mayors and the country's first socialist U.S. Congressman. **America's Socialist Experiment** recounts both the victories and failures of a unique brand of socialism in this historically conservative city.

Milwaukee's socialist mayors were widely respected for ending corruption, improving conditions for working people and cleaning up the environment. These socialist mayors established the nation's first municipal public housing project, pressed for an 8-hour work day and enacted the first workers' compensation law, as well as the first iterations of what would later become Social Security.

Working with the private sector, they created an extensive public parks system, appointed the country's first director of parks and recreation, and left a legacy of government support for its citizens' quality of life. They also established a public health strategy that doubled life expectancy in the city, which was one of the reasons Milwaukee escaped the worst of the 1918 Spanish Flu pandemic that ravaged other American cities.

Despite their many initiatives, the Milwaukee socialists always ran balanced budgets. But their socialist experiment was not without its failures: some programs were too optimistic and others created unintended consequences for their citizens.

Their decades-long rule in Milwaukee — the longest tenure of socialists in office anywhere in America—ended only when their once-radical plans were absorbed and incorporated into the mainstream Democratic platform. Today, both Democrats and Republicans lay claim to parts of their legacy.

Minor Injustice

Can we morally keep sending our youth to adult prisons?

During a single year, an estimated 2.1 million youth under the age of 18 are arrested in the United States. **Minor Injustice** focuses on the fight to raise the age of adult prosecution from 17 to 18 in the state of Texas. Right now, Texas is one of only 3 states that charges 17 year olds as adults.

During the 2017 legislative session there were two bills being introduced that addressed this issue. One to raise the age of adult prosecution from 17 to 18, and the other would allow people currently in prison

for a crime committed before the age of 18 a chance at early parole.

Currently, Texas sentencing laws ignore recent scientific evidence on adolescent development and neuroscience, and the state's current parole system provides no viable mechanism for reviewing a case after a young person has grown up and matured.

The Greatest Bond

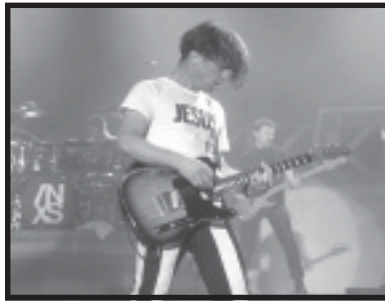


