 - Driven to Abstraction** details the scheme behind "the greatest forgery hoax ever of modern American art."
 - Latino Vote: Dispatches from the Battleground** follows the efforts of various groups working to ensure Latino voter turnout.

- With rousing fiddle tunes and Irish step-dancing performances, **Childsplay: The Parting Glass** captures the farewell concert of the acclaimed fiddle group.
- The Book Makers** highlights the talent, dedication and skill of book artists from around the world.- Nature** premieres **"Pandas: Born to be Wild,"** that follows two Chinese cinematographers who capture startling new wild panda behavior on screen, and **"Australian Bushfire Rescue,"** that shares inspiring stories of animal rescue and rehabilitation alongside remarkable tales of human compassion and dedication.

Flesh and Blood

Suspenseful and unexpectedly funny, “Flesh and Blood” is an unconventional mystery-thriller about family turmoil, airing in four cliffhanging episodes on **Masterpiece**.

Widowed for a year and a half, a glamorous former salon owner Vivien (Francesca Annis) invites her three children to their seaside childhood home for an important announcement: she has a new man in her life, Mark (Stephen Rae), a widowed retired surgeon.

Vivien’s budding romance provokes suspicion among her inquisitive next-door neighbor and the three siblings. Wrapped up in their own complicated relationships, the children have mixed reactions—from slightly wary to downright hostile to excited.

The drama opens with emergency vehicles on the scene of a life-threatening mishap. The mystery for viewers is: Who has done what to whom? Was the unfortunate incident an accident or a heinous crime? A detective at the scene elicits the details in flashbacks; it all started innocently enough.

“Flesh and Blood” on **Masterpiece** can be seen on 3-2 Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 4th and Fridays at 10:00 p.m. beginning the 9th. It airs on 3-1 Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 4th and Mondays at 1:00 p.m. beginning the 5th.

COBRA

When Europe is about to be hit by a solar flare, members of the British Government must put their differences aside and work together to restore power after outages leave much of Britain in the dark. When the country is in trouble, the government meets in Cabinet Office Briefing Room A, which in acronym is known as COBRA.

A high stakes six-part drama, **COBRA** shows the inner workings of the British government and emergency services as the catastrophe unfolds.

Follow British Prime Minister Robert Sutherland (Robert Carlyle) and his COBRA committee—a team comprised of Britain’s leading experts, crisis contingency planners and most senior politicians—as they gather to deal with the unfolding national emergency and find a way to turn the lights back on. On the backdrop of violent unrest in the streets, difficult decisions will need to be made against the clock if the country is to survive.

COBRA will be broadcast on 3-2 Sundays at 9:00 p.m. beginning the 4th. Watch it on 3-1 Sundays at 8:00 p.m. beginning the 4th and Mondays at 2:00 p.m. beginning the 5th.

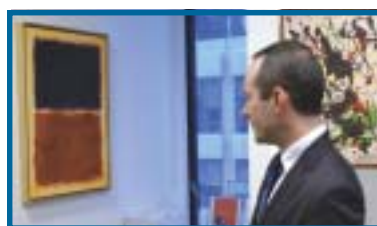
Driven to Abstraction

Along with drugs and arms, the art trade is the most unregulated in the world. The collectors prefer to be anonymous, the buyers prefer to be anonymous, and the prices are anonymous, all of which lends itself to “the greatest forgery hoax ever of modern American art”—a scheme detailed in the 90-minute film **Driven to Abstraction**.

In November 2011, the arthouse Knoedler & Company—New York City’s oldest and most venerable gallery—mysteriously ceased operations in the middle of a show. During the previous fifteen years, Ann Freedman, the esteemed president of Knoedler, had purchased 40 paintings from Glafira Rosales, a Long Island art dealer who seemed to have stumbled onto a treasure trove of masterworks—all of which would later be discovered to be forgeries.

Freedman sold the fraudulent paintings—an astounding \$60 million of forged work attributed to such modern American masters as Mark Rothko and Jackson Pollock.

Was Freedman the victim of a con artist who showed up with an endless collection of previously unseen abstract expressionist masterpieces? Or did she eventually sus-



pect they were fakes, yet continue to sell them for many millions of dollars?

Whatever the truth, two women from very different worlds were, wittingly or not, caught up in a forgery scandal that rocked the art world.

Eventually, buyers started getting their big ticket paintings verified, only to have them rejected by experts. Some cited historical inaccuracies, like paint that didn’t exist until after an artist’s death, and their signature on the work misspelled (“Pollok”).

The FBI traced the money to tax evasion, money laundering and to a modest house in Queens and a lone, elderly forger who claimed he did not know his paintings were being sold.

Driven to Abstraction will be broadcast on 3-2 Sunday, the 11th at 5:30 p.m. and Sunday, the 25th at 10:00 p.m. It can be seen on 3-1 Tuesday, the 27th at 7:00 p.m. on KENW-TV.

The Trouble with Maggie Cole

See what happens when idle gossip escalates out of control in the six-part comedy **The Trouble with Maggie Cole**.

Set in the fishing village of Thurlbury, the series follows the local busybody, Maggie (Dawn French), who refers to herself as a “local historian.”

Maggie is delighted when a radio journalist interviews her about village life. But, as he plies her with drink, Maggie is unable to resist divulging the secrets of six other villagers she holds dear. When her chitchat is later broadcast for all to hear, Maggie’s entire world is turned upside down.

Though racked with guilt for her pointless gossip, Maggie has somehow managed to hit a seam of truth about two or three of the village characters, and thus the stage is set for confrontations and reckonings.

The Trouble with Maggie Cole will be broadcast on 3-2 Sundays at 7:00 p.m. beginning the 18th. On 3-1, it airs Sundays at 6:00 p.m. beginning the 18th and Tuesdays at 1:00 p.m. beginning the 20th.

LATINO VOTE

Dispatches from the Battleground

Latino Vote: Dispatches from the Battleground is an up-to-the-minute look at the ever-evolving 2020 election through the eyes of Latino voters who are poised to be the largest racial or ethnic group eligible to vote in a presidential election.

Historically known as “the sleeping giant,” the Latino vote has been an elusive prize, but many believe that 2020 will be the year the giant awakens. Latino voters turned out at unprecedented rates in the 2018 mid-terms and candidates have stepped up their courting.

Told through a series of immersive dispatches from the battleground states of Nevada, Texas, Florida and Pennsylvania, **Latino Vote: Dispatches from the Battleground** follows the efforts of grassroots organizers, community leaders and political operatives working to ensure Latino voter turnout. The film follows left-leaning progressives as well as Latino evangelicals, many of whom support President Donald Trump.

The film begins in Las Vegas as candidates reach out to Latino workers ahead of the February caucus and then moves on to Super Tuesday, March 3rd, when Joe Biden’s candidacy seems assured. But less than two weeks later, the country is struck



by an unexpected calamity: a pandemic that ravages communities both rural and urban, with Latinos bearing a disproportionate brunt of the devastation.

Soon, the country is roiled again by the May 25th killing of George Floyd. What effect this seismic shift in the national landscape will have on Latino voters in November is a question organizers and candidates are hoping to answer as this very unique election draws near.

With Latino voters poised to be a powerful non-white bloc this November, **Latino Vote** introduces viewers to those on the ground, working to realize this promise.

Narrated by Tara Setmayer, political commentator and former GOP Communications Director on Capitol Hill, **Dismantling Democracy**, a three-part series, examines new and old democratic structures of government in the United States and around the world.

Driving While Black

Driving While Black, a two-hour film by acclaimed historian Dr. Gretchen Sorin and Emmy-winning director Ric Burns, chronicles the history of African Americans on the road from the 1930s to the 1960s, a crucial and transformative period in American racial, cultural and social history. For African Americans, travel by automobile during these years posed a paradox: although cars freed them from the tyranny of the Jim Crow bus or train, they faced intimidation and even violence when they ventured out on the road.

Driving While Black opens an entirely new view onto the African American experience, and shows why travel was so central to the Civil Rights movement.

Drawing on a rich archive of material from the period—including footage, photographs, advertisements, road signs, maps, letters and legal records—the film explores the genre of travel literature aimed at helping black travelers navigate Jim Crow America.

At the heart of this story is New York City mailman Victor Hugo Green’s famous *The Green Book*, a travel guide begun in 1936, which made possible that most basic American right—the family vacation—and encouraged a new method of resisting oppression.

From a first edition focused on the Northeast, Green expanded his guide to include much of the country, providing travel tips for African Americans driving, including black-only hotels and safe places to stop, dine and rest, as well as places to avoid, given the potential for racially motivated violence.

Central to this unique travel literature and the social issues that made it necessary lies a powerfully revealing narrative of freedom, mobility and race in America—one still relevant and resonant today.

The Infiltrators

"The Infiltrators" on **POV** is a true story of two young immigrants who are on a mission to stop deportations. And the best place to stop deportations, they believe, is in detention.

The story focuses on the Broward Transitional Center in South Florida, a private facility that holds undocumented immigrants and asylum seekers, and some "dreamers."

Broward detains people who have not committed crimes. Because there are no charges against them, they have no legal representation. They wait, sometimes for years, for an outcome, which is usually getting deported to Mexico, Honduras,



and the Congo and other countries, where in many cases, their lives are in danger.

Risking their own deportation, Marco and Viri, playacting ridiculous and even comical stereotypes about Hispanics, get themselves detained in Broward where they hope to help inmates and subvert the place.

In the summer of 1881, as part of the First International Polar Year, the U.S. Army sent Lieutenant Adolphus W. Greely and a team of 24 men to build a scientific research station on Ellesmere Island, located 450 miles from the North Pole. Known as the Lady Franklin Bay Expedition, it began as the most ambitious arctic mission in American history, but would end in a perilous voyage of forced retreat, brewing mutiny, starvation and cannibalism.

More than 120 years later, a team of scientists, field guides and Greely's great, great grandson set out to retrace the expedition's story by kayak, as well as examine the legacy of Greely and the Lady Franklin Bay Expedition.

Abandoned in the Arctic chronicles their modern-day journey while weaving in the historical retelling of the Greely expedition through narration, voice actor readings of diary entries and letters, re-enactment and archival photographs.

Pandas: Born to be Wild

The Giant Panda may be one of the most recognizable endangered species on our planet, but the daily lives of wild pandas remain a mystery, until now. Filmed over three years, “Pandas: Born to be Wild” on **Nature** follows two Chinese cinematographers on a trek through the Qinling Mountains to catch a glimpse of wild pandas. They capture startling new wild panda behavior on screen that reveals, unlike the playful image of captive pandas, wild pandas are solitary and territorial.

A young cub (shown at right) in the Wolong Panda Center will spend three years in a large enclosure in the reserve, separate from all other pandas and humans. He is being trained to be introduced into the wild when he reaches three years old. With his mother’s guidance, he learns crucial skills such as climbing trees and exploration, although there is still a risk that he will become too attached to his mother. Since caretakers are raising the young cub to never meet humans, they dress up in panda costumes and even mask their scent with panda urine. The cub, with its poor eyesight, is left none the wiser.

There are only around 2,000 Giant Pandas left in the world today. Although they are members of the bear family, pandas do not hibernate and therefore must keep feeding even throughout the winter months. Bamboo is a panda’s main food source, but it does not provide much nutrition. In order to maintain their energy, they must eat bamboo up to 14 hours each day.

Australian Bushfire Rescue

An estimated one billion animals died in the horrific Australian bushfires last year. Through the help of tireless volunteers working to rescue the remains of their once-flourishing environment, stories of animal and human resilience have emerged. Rising from the ashes, animal survivors begin their challenging journey back to a wild existence in **Nature**’s “Australian Bushfire Rescue.”

A series of digital shorts captured the immediate aftermath of the fires and relief efforts, including the rescue of an orphan wombat, the treatment of one of Australia’s deadliest snakes, and the story of a selfless citizen who turned her home into an animal sanctuary.

Inspired by those journeys, the film also follows iconic species like koalas, kangaroos and endangered species of parrots as they face a series of hurdles to recover from their trauma and go back into the wild. Their stories of rescue, rehabilitation and eventual release sit alongside the remarkable tales of human compassion and dedication from their rescuers and caretakers.

Touching the Asteroid

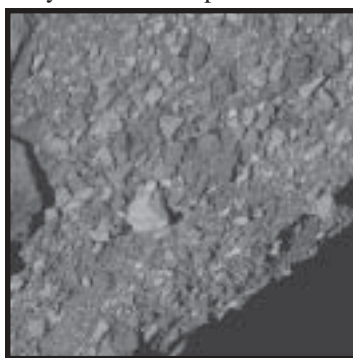
In “Touching the Asteroid,” **Nova** follows a mission that might prove impossible. But if successful, scientists could gain great insight into Earth’s own origins—and even learn to defend against rogue asteroids that may one day threaten our planet.

In the fall of 2020, a NASA spacecraft called OSIRIS-REx attempts to reach out and grab a piece of an asteroid named Bennu and bring it back to Earth. The OSIRIS-REx team has just three chances to extend its spacecraft’s specialized arm, touch down for five seconds, and collect material from the surface of Bennu. Can they pull it off?

Nova takes you inside the mission as the team plans its approach: They must map the asteroid’s surface, choose possible collection sites, and rehearse the risky maneuver.

But according to recent studies, the asteroid Bennu may prove tough to tame. The 1700-foot-wide rocky body, which orbits the Sun in a rough loop that’s often close to Earth, has an unexpectedly rubbly and active surface that appears to be spewing gravel-sized particles into space. These geologic surprises could throw a serious wrench into NASA’s mission to scoop up samples of the asteroid to ferry back to Earth for further analysis.

Can We Cool the Planet?

“Can We Cool the Planet?” on **Nova** joins scientists and skeptics alike to examine technologies that could help us combat a looming threat.

The world’s average temperature has increased 1°C in just the past 100 years. Extreme weather and rising seas are already causing global unrest, and many scientists believe that if we cannot curb planetary warming, it could pose an existential threat to human civilization as we know it.

As time is running out for conventional solutions to global warming, a growing collective of scientists and engineers are developing technologies to hack Earth’s operating system—from manipulating our atmosphere to reflect sunlight, to sucking carbon dioxide right out of the air, to enlisting plants to do the job for us. This is the controversial landscape of geoengineering, the effort to build controls for Earth’s thermostat.
