The Takeaway: Seeing the Bigger Picture

Do you ever find yourself feeling like the news is just an endless stream of information, overwhelming its audience and lacking any real sense of reflection? If so, you might want to give *The Takeaway* a try.

If you listen to KIOS in the late morning, you've probably already caught a bit of the show which airs weekdays from 11:00 am to 12:00 pm. It replaced *The Story* which ceased production near the end of last year. *The Takeaway* offers up-to-date information about the most pressing national and international issues.

It doesn't just provide information, however. *The Takeaway* also seeks to synthesize the material, sticking with a few key topics each episode, and providing context and weight. Rather than overwhelming its listeners, *The Takeaway* leaves its audience with a sense of what is at the heart of the issue as well as a greater understanding of its broader implications.

Covering topics ranging from international policy to the key to happiness in one episode, this one hour program is public radio at its best. Much of its success is owed to its host, John Hockenberry, who is no novice to the field.

Emmy and Peabody-Award winner, Hockenberry has worked in journalism for over twenty years, namely as a Dateline NBC correspondent. His diverse experience makes him a credible reporter and warm interviewer, maintaining a sense of enthusiasm for public issues.

In each episode, Hockenberry calls on a diverse set of panelists which help give voice to a greater variety of perspectives. From experts in the field to on-air questions from callers, the show's discussions feel well-rounded and accessible.

So whether you think of yourself as an intellectual, a political news junkie, or just someone who likes hearing new information, this show should offer something for you. Its midday spot in our

line-up makes it a perfect way to break-up the humdrum of the day with an engaging dialogue.

Marketplace Morning Report is a seven-minute business news segment, produced by American Public Media, now in partnership with NPR. Host David Brancaccio helps listeners get a jump on global business and economic news and a glance ahead to what's making headlines throughout the day.

New Program: Jazz Night In America

Jazz Night In America, a new one-hour weekly live concert program made its debut on KIOS on Friday October 10th at 8:00 pm. The program is a new partnership between WBGO, *Jazz at Lincoln Center* and NPR Music that will present the live jazz experience on multiple media platforms.

The new show, hosted by Christian McBride, will combine the elements of *JazzSet*, produced by WBGO, which ended its run on October 3rd, and WFMT's *Jazz At Lincoln Center*. The program will not only be a weekly radio broadcast, but it will offer 26 online video-casts and on-demand video that will feature storytelling and concert performances from venues around the country. Jazz fans will also be brought together online via chat rooms during concerts and through social media, encouraging conversations with musicians, arts organizations and the major institutions of the jazz world.

Plans are in the works for *Jazz Night In America* to be regularly featured on

NPR's daily newsmagazines *Morning Edition* and *All Things Considered* with artist profiles, features, and interviews.

Meet the Voices: Mike Jacobs

Mike Jacobs began his career in radio in August 1988 at KIOS working the morning shift on weekends. Mike had graduated from Technical High School in 1984 as a member of the last graduating class. He went through Tech's radio and television program, receiving much of his training in broadcast production before moving on to the University of Nebraska at Omaha.

"My time at Tech was very valuable because it gave me a real workplace experience at KIOS and it provided an opportunity to learn about jazz and classical music from the staff," Mike says.

Eventually, Mike would become the local host for *Morning Edition* in 1990 before focusing all his attention on hosting music programs in 1996. His *Blues In The Afternoon* show, airing Mondays, celebrated its 20th anniversary on October 6th.

Mike also spent time at two other stations. He did an overnight shift on the weekends at KKCD 105.9 playing

classic rock from 1993-96 and spent the summer of 1996 working nights at KFAB. Mike became Music Director at KIOS in 2002.

"I really didn't have a clearly defined career path early on" Mike says. "It's amazing that I found my way back to the Tech building and KIOS and was able to do the work I always dreamed of doing."

Outside of work, Mike is a member of the Omaha Blues Society, is a devoted Cincinnati Reds fan, and attends the Indy 500 every year.
