## NPR Music is holding another Tiny Desk Contest.

Since its launch in 2008, nearly 500 performances have been recorded at the Tiny Desk, the festive workspace of NPR Music's Bob Boilen, adorned with years of music mementos and memorabilia. The series has provided a welcoming stage for artists at all points in their careers and from across the genre spectrum.
Now, for the second year, NPR Music is holding a Tiny Desk Contest for unsigned artists of all genres to compete for a spot at the Tiny Desk, along with a four-part event tour.

The Tiny Desk Contest was inspired by NPR Music's desire to help fans find music they love and support artists throughout their careers. During its inaugural run in spring 2015, the challenge received entries from nearly 6,000 music makers across all 50 states.

This year's contest began in January. A panel of musicians from the Tiny Desk roster -- Dan Auerbach of The Black Keys and The Arcs, Lucius ladies Jess Wolfe and Holly Laessig, and soul artist Son Little -- will join All Songs Considered hosts Bob Boilen and Robin Hilton in selecting one Contest winner, to be announced in March 2016.
