Hours per week: Varies according to work demand. Must be available to work during the weekends and holidays.

Hours Worked: Students should expect an average of 10-15 hours of work per week.

Summary: This internship will be a hands-on experience where interns will “learn by doing.” Interns will learn how to write, edit and produce a variety of NPR style radio pieces that will be published on KRCU.org and broadcasted on 90.9FM/88.9FM.

Duties include: Conducting one-on-one interviews; research and prepare background information on story leads and interview subjects; gather and produce local news reports and features for radio and web broadcast; generate story ideas; use field equipment and audio production software.

This internship offers a rewarding opportunity to gain experience in research, journalism, and broadcasting. The intern will be treated as a professional capable of producing professional results.
