- Bob Giles how are you planning to connect with the broader Traverse City community?
 - First step the community meeting held with Trey last week
 - How can we help each other? (Regional organizations and ICA)
 - IPR is the voice of Interlochen to the region
 - Citizen artistry: it's not that the community that comes to the artist any more; artists are at the center of communities.
- Suzy Voltz How to connect to the region at large? (Not just Traverse City)
 - Example: Bay Harbor arts center opening
 - We need to connect to the region
- Tom Quinn Is the board willing to continue the support of IPR ("subsidy")?
 - There is definitely a gap in resources and needs for IPR.
 - We're looking for ways to improve the fundraising support for IPR, as well as ways to make operational changes to close this gap.
 - The Board wants to narrow the gap; it shouldn't get larger.
 - Bottom line: Let's work to narrow that gap. It's not going to happen overnight, but we need to be moving in that direction.

- Program Updates Peter (15)
 - Program changes
 - Not too much change; respondents were fairly happy
 - Were able to reduce costs around the programs we already have
 - Will be eliminating jazz from our Classical station
 - Will be airing jazz, mostly through ICA productions
 - Adding "Harmonia" and "Afterglow" to the schedule
 - Bringing back Thistle and Shamrock
 - Changes will occur in September
 - No shows cancelled on News
 - Picking up Live Wire Radio and Truth, Politics and Power at very little cost
 - Will replace repeat of the Takeaway with a grid of shows including On the Media, Living on Earth, and TED
 - Considering elimination of Prairie Home on Sunday Morning
 - Cost analysis
 - Reviewed budget considerations for IPR (programming costs and contributions) as well as rising costs for programming.
 - Discussed decision to redo the tower in the north

 - IPR plans to apply for funding through the Rotary Charities for a weekly public affairs program, to build a team of community producers, and to integrate "The Kids' Commute" into local schools
