Wyoming Public Media continues its tradition of broadcasting the Grand Teton Music Festival's opening concert live from Walk Festival Hall in Jackson Hole. Micah Schweizer will host the July 4<sup>th</sup> *Patriotic Pops* celebration, as the Festival Orchestra performs patriotic favorites such as the *Armed Forces Salute* and *America the Beautiful*. Listen live Wednesday, July 4 at 6 p.m. on Wyoming Public Radio and Classical Wyoming. Weekly taped broadcasts of the GTMF on Wyoming Public Radio and Classical Wyoming begin on Wednesday, July 18 at 8 p.m., repeating Sunday afternoons at 4:00 p.m. on Classical Wyoming.

"The Grand Teton Music Festival is a cultural highlight, and it's exciting to bring the experience to the entire state and beyond," said Schweizer.

In the meantime, here are few of my picks for you to peruse. These are productions or activities that you may not normally catch.

Archives on the Air - Archives on the Air takes listeners deep into the archives of the University of Wyoming's American Heritage Center. The AHC collects and preserves primary sources and rare books from Wyoming, the Rocky Mountain Region, and select aspects of the American and global past. Voiced by Assistant Archivist Molly Marcusse, each new episode of *Archives on the Air* reveals a fascinating tidbit from the AHC's vast collection.

Wyoming Minute - This one-minute audio snapshot of Wyoming has been around for a few years. It's overseen by cultural Affairs Director, Micah Schweizer, and assisted by a talented group of interns and volunteers. Recently, we added "Museum Minute," pieces produced by Kamila Kudelska, WPM/Buffalo Bill Center of the West multi-media journalist. Kamila's pieces highlight the culture of the West through content found at the Center. You can find out about a mountain lion you can't resist petting, and Amelia Earhart's visit to Meeteetse. We hope to eventually bring all Wyoming museums to our radio and online audiences.
