From the Desk of the General Manager:

I'm going to ask for your help, but first I want to tell you that the latest (Fall 2009) Arbitron media survey results are in, and WVPE is still one of the Top 10 radio stations in the total South Bend market. We average over 65,000 different listeners each week. This tells me that we definitely have an audience that is hungry for the kind of news, information, & entertainment that this station provides. However, WVPE has just over 5,000 households receiving this newsletter. That's a big gap between listeners and members, even assuming 2 members per household. Presently, then, 1 in 6 households who listen to WVPE understand and follow through on the "public radio" needs "public support" concept. It stands to reason that many of our listener-only audience happen to be your friends, colleagues, and business associates. So as WVPE holds our spring pledge drive, we ask that besides renewing your own membership, that you consider mentioning your renewal to the people with whom you have previously discussed stories heard on WVPE. Will you encourage them to follow your lead and make a membership pledge?

There is one more way that your influence can help. In the past year, WVPE has experienced a significant loss in underwriting income due to the difficult economic climate. Nearly 80% of our members say they often patronize businesses specifically because those companies support WVPE. But, we know not everyone tells these businesses the reason for their patronage. So, if you do business with our underwriters (listed in this guide), please thank them for their support of public radio. Hearing a customer say "I heard about you on WVPE" is valuable to our business supporters – and us!
